

PARKING REQUIREMENTS

Building code requirements as detailed in Village ordinances 5 and 11.

Permitted Uses

11.03:

Parking includes temporary on-street parking for all trailers and camping equipment. Off-street parking must follow the setback requirements of each district and must be parked on paved or surfaced areas, with the exception of vehicles being used for continuous construction projects.

Off-street Parking –

11.13:

- No parking in the front or side yards adjoining to a public street, except on a permanent, paved driveway.
- All vehicles must be parked entirely on the paved surfaces.
- No parking between the closest curb line of a street and the front property line.
- No commercial vehicles over 12 ton rated capacity, vehicles equipped and used for auto salvage, or commercial trailers can be stored in a residential district.
- No repair work, dismantling, servicing, or sales of automobiles is allowed on the parking area of a property.

Parking of Trailers, Mobile Homes, and Seasonal Recreation Vehicles

5.03:

Parking of seasonal use trailers, utility trailers, and camping equipment outside of a garage is not allowed on any residentially or commercially zoned property, except with the following exceptions, and then on paved driveways in the front or side yard only:

- Trailers for motorcycles: March 1 – November 15
- Camping Equipment: March 1 – November 15
- Watercraft and trailer: March 1 – The end of open water fishing as determined by the WDNR
- Snowmobiles and trailer: November 1 – March 31
- ATVs and trailer: Year round
- Empty trailers: Year round
- Pop-up trailers not exceeding 20 feet in the closed position: Year round
- Utility trailer: Year round

Trailers are limited to 2 per property, but may not be parked adjacent to each other, with the exception of a utility trailer. Trailers must be parked within 10 feet of the primary structure. The parked trailer must follow the setback requirements in the respective zone in which it is parked, with a minimum setback of 4 feet.

Storage –

5.04:

No wrecked, dismantled, non-operable, or unlicensed vehicles, parts, or other equipment that is deemed unsafe by the Village may be stored on a property that is not authorized for such purposes.

This information shall not be considered as a full comprehensive view of the Village parking code. All applicable code provisions shall be followed.
