## Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

Topic: Recreational Fires

With the onset of spring weather, many people will be moving to the outdoors after being cooped up all winter. Spring is usually a busy time for fires. Winds accompany spring can spread a fire very quickly. Allouez has strict ordinances against open burning in the Village limits.

Brush, grass, trash and any other fires other than authorized recreational or cooking fires are illegal and the originator is responsible for all citations, fines and liability. Yard waste and trash belong on your curb properly set for removal.

To have a safe and legal recreational fire you must follow your city or village ordinances. The Village of Allouez's ordinance on recreational fires can be found at [www.villageofallouez.com](http://www.villageofallouez.com) but here are some of the high points;

- No recreational fire shall be closer than 15 ft. from any building, structure, shed, garage, and no closer than 15 ft. from any tree, shrub, bush, fence, or any other combustible material.
- You must obtain a permit from the village to have a recreational fire.
- If you rent property, you must obtain written permission from the owner to have a recreational fire
- Must have an extinguishing source such as a garden hose present
- Fire must be attended at all times by a responsible adult of 18 years or older.
- Smoke that is a nuisance may require that you extinguish your fire.
- You are responsible for any and all damages that may result from a recreational fire.

Good judgment and common sense will keep you out of trouble. Failure to abide by the ordinance may result in fines. A recreational fire can be fun and safe for everyone as long as you adhere to the ordinance and you respect your neighbors.

- *March 20th: Deputy Mueller responded to a residence in the 3300 block of East River Dr for a damage to property complaint. The caller reported a window on her vehicle being smashed out sometime overnight. No suspects at this time.*
- *March 24th: Deputy VonHaden responded to an address in the 500 block of W. Briar Ln. for a theft report. The caller reported an IPAD missing and named an in-home caretaker as a possible suspect. Report completed and sent to the Investigative Division.*

The caller provided possible suspect information. Deputy Vogel is attempting to identify/locate the suspects.*
- *In the month of March Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 603 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 233 traffic stops, 32 traffic crashes, 19 disturbances, and 35 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

**Item #1**

On March 2, Deputy Shield and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 3900 block of East River Dr. for an unwanted/unknown male party that had entered the caller's bedroom. Deputies located the male in the street upon arrival. Upon questioning it was found that the male lives across the street from the caller and was very intoxicated. The male was arrested for trespassing and disorderly conduct.

**Item #2**

On March 8, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 3400 block of East River Dr. for a male vs. female physical disturbance. Deputies interviewed the parties involved and arrested the male party for disorderly conduct, damage to property, and battery.

**Item #3**

On March 9, Deputies responded to a residence in the 1300 block of S. Irwin Ave for a report of a male vs. female disturbance. After interviewing the parties involved the male was arrested for disorderly conduct and damage to property.

**Item #4**

On March 11, Deputy Shield conducted a traffic stop for expired registration on Hoffman Rd. near Cameo Ct. A passenger in the vehicle was found to have warrants for his arrest. The passenger was arrested for the warrants and the operator was given a warning for expired registration.

**Item #5**

On March 11, Deputy Mleziva conducted a traffic stop on Webster Ave. near McCormick St. During the stop Deputy Mleziva could smell the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. A subsequent search of the vehicle resulted in the seizure of drug paraphernalia. The driver was cited for possession of drug paraphernalia.

**Item #6**

On March 14, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Loppnow responded to McDonald's on Webster Avenue Market for a complaint of an intoxicated male party drinking in the restaurant. McDonald's employees wanted the male to leave the restaurant. Contact was made with the male, who was intoxicated and on probation. The male was arrested for violating the terms of his probation by drinking alcohol.

**Item #7**

On March 16, Deputy Shield located a vehicle in Green Isle Park after hours. Shield stopped the vehicle and made contact with the occupants. Shield observed the odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. After further investigation and questioning, two occupants of the vehicle were cited for possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

**Item #8**

On March 20, Deputy Mueller responded to the Mobile Station on Webster Ave for a complaint of theft of cash by an employee. After interviewing the employee and collecting evidence the employee was arrested/jailed for theft.

**Item #9**

On March 22, Deputy Verheyen stopped a vehicle on Monroe Ave. at Marine St. The operator was found to be intoxicated and arrested/cited for operating while intoxicated.

**Item #10**

On March 26, Deputy Loppnow stopped a vehicle in the parking lot of the Heritage Hill Water tower. Deputy Loppnow recognized the passenger in the vehicle as the registered owner of the vehicle, who had a warrant for his arrest. The operator of the vehicle was also found to have a warrant for her arrest. Both parties were arrested for their warrants. The operator was also cited for operating while suspended and the passenger was also cited for possession of marijuana after a small amount of marijuana was located in the vehicle.

**Item #11**

On March 29, Deputy Shield stopped a vehicle in Greene Isle Park after hours. After questioning the occupants of the vehicle a search of the vehicle was conducted. Suspected marijuana was located in the vehicle that the operator claimed as his. The operator was cited for operating without a license and possession of marijuana.

**Item #12**

On March 29, Deputy Shield and other Deputies responded to the 1100 block of Garland St. for four males possibly breaking into vehicles. The caller reported seeing two of the males going through their neighbor's vehicle. The males were located and identified. In checking with possible victim's it appeared that no items were actually taken from vehicle's. The four males were cited for curfew violations and prowling.
