### Village of Allouez Prescription Drop-Off



On **April 29, 2017**, the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) will coordinate a Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative throughout Wisconsin. The Prescription Drug Take-Back Day goal is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposal of prescription medications, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of these medications. Unused prescription medications in homes create a public health and safety concern, because they can be accidentally ingested, stolen, misused, and abused.

In coordination with the Brown County Drug Task Force and the WI Department of Justice, the Village of Allouez will be accepting unused/unwanted prescriptions and over the counter medications for proper disposal.

# SMOKE AND CO ALARMS



Did you know that smoke alarms are only good for 10 years then you have to get new ones?.

Here is why alarms are only good for 10 years;

- 10 years of dust and dirt have accumulated inside your smoke detector.
- Even if your smoke detector has never sounded, it has performed over 3.5 million “air sensing” cycles over 10 years.
- The most common type of smoke alarm (ionization) utilizes a radioactive element and this type of alarm detects fast flaming fires quicker.
- Photoelectric smoke detectors use a beam of light to detect smoke which also loses its effectiveness over time. It is good at detecting slow smoldering fires.

It is also extremely important to test your smoke detectors monthly to make sure that are in working order. Untested detectors are half as dependable as tested ones. To test your detectors do the following;

- Hold the test button in on the alarm until it beeps. Do this once a month to all alarms.
  - If the alarm fails to sound, replace the battery to see if that remedies the problem.
  - NEVER use real smoke to test an alarm such as cigarette smoke or smoke from a match or candle. Smoke contains carbon which can deposit inside your smoke detector essentially making it “dirty” inside.
  - Replace any alarms that fail to sound immediately if they are found to be faulty.
  - When replacing alarms, make sure both smoke alarm sensing technologies (Ionization and Photoelectric) are present in your home.

## **POLICE INCIDENTS**

In the month of March, Brown County Sheriff's Office deputies responded to or initiated approximately 659 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 270 Traffic Stops, 26 traffic crashes, 22 welfare checks, and 18 disturbance calls. The following is a brief synopsis of some of those calls.

- ***March 2<sup>nd</sup>***: Brown County Investigator Sgt. P. Nelson investigated a case of theft and fraud against a financial institution. One of the victims lives on the 600 block of E. Briar Ln. here in the Village of Allouez. Multiple fraudulent checks were cashed at a local bank. A female and male suspect were identified and later located. Both provided statements. Sgt. Nelson is charging the male suspect with 3 counts of Theft of over \$2,500 and 3 counts of Fraud against a Financial Institution.
- ***March 5<sup>th</sup>***: At approx. 11:00pm, Deputy Z. Walters responded to an address on the 700 block of E. Briar Ln. for a report of a suspicious situation. The victim reported an unknown suspect entered their home and stole their cupcakes. The victim stated that nothing besides the cupcakes were missing or out of place. The victim has no suspects in regards to the theft and simply wanted the incident documented.
- ***March 14<sup>th</sup>***: At approx. 5:00am, Deputy J. Baudry was dispatched to the Webster Shell, located at 1501 S. Webster Ave., for a report of burglary. It was reported entry was made during the night and that the suspect possibly had a key to the business. Evidence was collected and a list of suspects were obtained. The case was forwarded to the Brown County Sheriff's Office Investigative Unit for further investigation.
- ***On March 16<sup>th</sup>***: Deputy J. Rusk responded to an address on the 3500 block of E. River Dr. for a report of fraud. The victim reported she suspected her financial advisor of taking money from her bank account to make credit card payments. Statement obtained and report completed by Deputy Rusk. Report forwarded to the Investigation Unit.
- ***On March 19<sup>th</sup>***: Deputy D. Fameree responded to an address on the 200 block of Rosemont Dr. for a report of fraud. The victim reported an unknown suspect making charges on their debit card. The charges appeared to be coming out of Madison, WI. A statement was obtained and the report was forwarded to the Investigative Unit.

### **Item #1**

On March 1<sup>st</sup>, at approx. 1:00am, Deputy C. Brown, multiple deputies, and Green Bay Metro Fire Department were dispatched to the Bellin Psychiatric Center, located at 301 E. St. Joseph St, for an out of control adult who had just punched a hole in the wall in the lobby area. The adult male was detained and transported to an emergency room for evaluation. Incident report completed by Deputy Brown.

### **Item #2**

On March 4<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 3:00am, Deputy Brown made contact with a suspicious occupied vehicle parked on East River Dr. near Somerset Dr. The operator was identified and during this conversation an odor of marijuana was detected coming from the vehicle. The operator was searched and a small baggie with a green leafy substance was located on his person. The vehicle was searched with drug paraphernalia and alcohol being located. The operator was issued citations for Controlled Substance Violation, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, and Underage Person Transport Intoxicants in a Motor Vehicle.

**Item #3**

On March 4<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 11:15pm, Deputy R. Wagner performed a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. for speeding. While speaking with the occupants Deputy Wagner detected an odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The operator admitted to smoking marijuana at his house minutes before they left. Deputy Raska was working OWI patrol and specializes as a certified Drug Recognition Expert (DRE). Deputy Raska was called to the scene and performed field sobriety tests on the operator. The vehicle was searched with controlled substances and drug paraphernalia being located inside. A DOT record check was performed on all occupants of the vehicle. A warrant was found for the operator of the vehicle. The operator was later transported to the Brown County Jail on this warrant. While at the jail, the operator was issued citations for OWI-Restricted Controlled Substance 1<sup>st</sup> Offense, Controlled Substance Violation, Possession of Drug Paraphernalia, Operating Motor Vehicle After Suspension, and Speeding.

**Item #4**

March 8<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 1:30am, Deputy Brown performed a traffic stop on a vehicle speeding on Webster Ave. While speaking with operator Deputy Brown detected an odor of alcohol emitting from the vehicle. Field sobriety tests were performed in which the operator failed. The operator was arrested for OWI 1<sup>st</sup> Offense. The operator was issued citations for speeding and OWI. The operator was later turned over to a responsible party.

**Item #5**

March 8<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 10:30am, Deputy J. Rusk and multiple deputies were dispatched to an address on the 3400 block of East River Dr. for a report of a disturbance. It was reported an adult male was attempting to break into a house. The suspect then left the scene before police arrival to the house. The suspect was located driving in the Allouez area and a traffic stop was performed. The suspect was arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of Criminal Damage to Property, Disorderly Conduct, Possession of Electric Weapon, and Possession of THC.

**Item #6**

On March 11<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 11:15am, Deputy Rusk, Deputy C. Resch, and Deputy T. Prochaska were dispatched to an address on the 100 block of Rosemont Dr. for a report of a disturbance between a male and a female. Statements were obtained from both parties involved. With the information obtained, the female was believed to be the primary aggressor for this incident. The female was taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Disorderly Conduct and Criminal Damage to Property. Charges are being referred to the DA's Office on the male for DVO Disorderly Conduct.

**Item #7**

March 14<sup>th</sup>, The Brown County Drug Task Force (DTF) performed an operation involving search warrants on multiple addresses in the County of Brown and City of Green Bay for drug activity. DEO Vogel assisted DTF with a search of an address on the 1800 block of S. Quincy St. Investigation on going with multiple drug charges pending on individuals from this address.

**Item #8**

March 15<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 7:00pm, Deputy Walters performed a traffic stop on a vehicle on Libal St. The operator of the vehicle was identified and a DOT records check showed the operator had an outstanding warrant. The operator was taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail. At the jail the operator was issued a citation for Operating Motor Vehicle After Revocation of his Driver's License.

**Item #9**

March 28<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Brown and multiple deputies were dispatched to an address on the 3600 block of Sunnyslope St for a Male/Female disturbance. Deputies arrived and observed evidence that a physical disturbance had occurred. The male was taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Disorderly Conduct and Criminal Damage to Property.
