August 2015 Thefts/Stolen Items

There continues to be reports of thefts from vehicles in Allouez. On July 5 a suspect was located/arrested and admitted to entering several vehicles in the area. A Samsung Tablet was found on the suspect at the time of the arrest. When items such as the tablet are recovered it is often difficult for officers to identify the owner. In this case the tablet was actually owned by a business and had the business information on it. With that information the victim was identified. In too many cases victims of thefts report items stolen that have serial numbers, but the serial numbers are not known. When officers take theft reports we will always be looking for unique numbers or characteristics of the item stolen in order to identify it later. If serial numbers are available the numbers will be entered into our computer system as stolen. This way if the item is found later by any law enforcement officer, they can check the number and possibly identify the owner. I would encourage everyone in taking the time to document serial numbers on electronics, power tools, and other items that have them. Having the number documented and reported to police in the event of a theft will increase the chance of the item being returned to its owner.

Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

As most of you know, the Fire Department is responsible for the Village of Allouez's emergency medical services. Strokes are one of the medical emergencies that the Green Bay Metro Fire Department comes across on a regular basis.

A stroke or "brain attack" occurs when a blood clot blocks an artery or a blood vessel breaks, interrupting blood flow to an area of the brain. When either of these things happens, brain cells begin to die and brain damage occurs.

New studies show that most people never use that window of opportunity to avoid the worst consequences of a brain attack. Instead of seeking immediate emergency medical help, they overlook the symptoms, deny that anything so serious can happen to them, and wait. Here are some of the signs and symptoms of a stroke which come on suddenly:

- Trouble seeing in one or both eyes
- Sever headache with no known cause
- Numbness or weakness of the face, arm or leg, especially on one side of the body
- Trouble walking, dizziness, loss of balance or coordination

Here is what you can use to test someone to see if they might be having a stroke. It is called the FAST system.

- **F**ace- Ask the person to smile and notice if one side of their face droops.
- **A**rms- Ask the person to raise both arms and notice for one arm drifting downward.
- **S**peech-See if the person can repeat a simple sentence without slurring.
- **T**ime-Time is important and if a person shows any of the signs and symptoms call 911 immediately.

The sooner a person suffering from a stroke receives medical attention the better. The hospital will be able to give medication that can break up the clot and restore blood flow to the brain thus minimizing damage to the brain cells.

- ***July 3: Deputy Vogel responded to an address in the 500 block of Greene Ave for a theft report. The caller reported a GPS unit stolen from an unlocked vehicle. No suspects at this time.***

- ***July 18th: Deputy Pizzala responded to an address in the 300 block of Hilltop Dr a theft complaint. The caller reported a laptop computer stolen from her unlocked vehicle. No suspects at this time.***
- ***July 22nd: Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 600 block of Green Avenue for a burglary report. The caller reported several window screens that appeared to have been cut open and minor damage to one window. The damage was consistent with an attempted burglary. No entry was made to the home. No suspects at this time.***
- ***July 30th: Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 500 block of Green Ave for a burglary complaint. The caller reported tools and several other items stolen from his unlocked & open garage overnight. No suspects at this time.***
- ***In the month of July Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 675 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 238 traffic Stops, 17 traffic crashes, 18 disturbances, and 43 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On July 2, Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 600 Block of Karl St. to attempt to locate a male with a warrant for his arrest. The male was located, arrested, and brought to jail for the warrant.

Item #2

On July 3, Deputies Mleziva and other Deputies responded to the area of Webster Ave. and St. Joseph St. for a complaint of a reckless driver. The suspect vehicle was located and stopped in the McDonalds parking lot. The driver was found to be intoxicated and arrested for third offense OWI.

Item #3

On July 5, Deputies responded to the area of the 400 block of Simonet St for a suspicious person that had attempted to enter a residence. The suspect was located in the area and found to be in possession of a Samsung Tablet. The suspect admitted to going through

numerous unlocked vehicle's in the area. The suspect was arrested for outstanding warrants and theft.

Item #4

On July 9, Deputy Knepfel and Deputy McGinty responded to an address on Eastwood Ave to attempt to locate a male with a probation and parole warrant. The male was located and arrested/jailed on the warrant.

Item #5

On July 18, Deputy Davidson and Deputy Miller responded to an address on Eastwood Ave to attempt to locate a male subject with a warrant for his arrest from the Department of Corrections. The male was located and arrested for the warrant.

Item #6

On July 20, Deputy Reese and other Deputies responded to an address on Clark St. for a report of a disturbance between a male and a female. Upon making contact with the parties involved the male was arrested and taken to jail for battery.

Item #7

On July 24, Deputy Mleziva and other Deputies responded to an address in the 2500 block of Libal St. for a disturbance over a child custody issue. After making contact with those involved one person was arrested for disorderly conduct.

Item #8

On July 29, Deputy Mleziva responded to the Webster Avenue Market for a retail theft complaint. The manager report two males taking a case of beer without paying. Store employees were able to get a license plate number from the vehicle the males left in. Deputy Mleziva was able to identify/contact one of the suspect from the license plate number, but the suspect refused to meet with Mleziva or give his current address/location. Deputy Mleziva was ultimately unable to locate/contact the suspect. Charges for retail theft referred to the Brown County District Attorney.

Item #9

On July 31, Deputy Winistorfer conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. near Taft st. The driver was found to have a suspended license and a warrant for his arrest. He was cited for operating with a suspended license and arrested for the outstanding warrant.
