## December/November 2016 Letter

I would like to take this opportunity to thank the organization Rebuilding Together for all the hard work they completed here in the Village of Allouez. There was a resident in Allouez that needed assistance in the up keep of their outdoor fence to keep it within code. The resident was doing everything in their power to keep the fence up and instead of issuing citations for code violations, other options were looked into. Rebuilding Together was contacted and very quickly set up a meeting with the resident at their home. Rebuilding Together presented this situation to their board of directors and the project was approved to reinforce the fence in question for years to come.

On Saturday, November 12<sup>th</sup>, 2016, Project Manager Mike Smiley and his team of approximately 15 volunteers responded to this location in the Village of Allouez. Volunteers dug out holes, pounded in new treated posts, and reinforced the fence. This act of generosity from Rebuilding Together was nothing short of a miracle for this resident. I can not thank Mike and the group of his volunteers enough for taking time out of their weekend to assist with this 5 hour project. ## Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

Every year, Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires in the U.S. according to National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). In previous years, the average number of home structure fires involving cooking equipment on Thanksgiving Day was 2000 fires (3X more than any other day)! Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. Each year, hundreds of people in the United States are killed in fires that involve cooking equipment and thousands more are injured.

Here are some tips for a safe Thanksgiving dinner;

- \* Stay IN the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
  - \* Stay IN the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently
    - \* Keep kids away from cooking areas.
- \* Turn pot handles inward to reduce the risk that pots with hot contents will be knocked over.
  - \* Keep combustibles away from your stove top.
  - \* Clean up food and grease from burners and the stove top.

A popular method for cooking turkeys is to deep fry them. Though you will probably end up with a juicier turkey, cooked in less than half the time, there are some dangers involved. Here is what you need to know.

- \* Fryers are to be used outdoors a safe distance from buildings. They aren't to be used on decks and in garages.
- \* Make sure the turkey is completely thawed (24 hours for every 5lbs in the fridge) and be careful with marinades. Oil and water don't mix, and water causes oil to spill over, causing a fire or even an explosion hazard.
  - \* As with all cooking, pay close attention to the fryer when you are using it.

### **October/November Police Reports**

This is a perfect time to remind everyone to lock their vehicles when parking in the driveway and to make sure to close and lock your garage doors at night.***
- ***October 22<sup>nd</sup>, Deputy K. Mason was sent to Webster Ave Market, located at 1220 S Webster Ave, for a report of retail theft. It was reported the 2 suspects (both described as Female/White) left the store without paying for meat products. Unknown suspects at this time. The area was checked but the suspects were not located. Video surveillance is being requested. Statement obtained from victim and incident report completed.***
- ***October 29<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Mason and P. Giesler responded to Midway Mobil gas station, located at 3907 S Webster Ave, for a report of retail theft. The clerk reported 2 suspects entered the store and stole cigars. The suspects left the store in a white vehicle. Deputy Mason was able to identify one of subjects inside the store and later issued a municipal citation for theft. The other subject has not been identified at this time. Investigation still open.***
- ***Oct. 31<sup>st</sup>, Deputy N. Nerat was dispatched to Green Isle Park for a damage report. Staff was reporting 3 pathway lights were damaged sometime during the past weekend. Deputy Nerat completed an incident report. No suspects at this time.***
- ***Nov. 1<sup>st</sup>, Deputy Mason was sent to an address on the 300 block of Dauphin St. for a report of fraud. The victim was reporting blank checks were stolen from her check book and cashed. The victim provided the name of one of her family members as a possible suspect. Report completed and turned over to the Brown County Sheriff's Office Investigative Unit for further investigation.***
- ***Nov. 21<sup>st</sup>, Deputy B. Vandehei was sent by dispatch to an address on the 1400 block of Bismarck St. for a burglary report. The victim was reporting an unknown suspect had kicked in their basement window during the night time hours. The victim reported the suspects today had taken change from a change jar. The victim reported that for the last two weeks multiple items have gone missing from her home but filed no police report. A statement was***

*taken from the victim and a report was completed that will be forwarded to the BCSO investigative unit.*

- In the month of October, deputies responded to or initiated approximately 581 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 127 Traffic Stops, 26 Traffic Crashes, 17 Disturbances, and 42 Suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls. In the month of November, deputies responded to or initiated approximately 557 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 144 Traffic stops, 34 Traffic crashes, 23 Disturbances, and 29 Suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

#### **Item #1**

On October 2<sup>nd</sup>, Deputy C. Brown responded to a residence in the 500 block of Beaupre St. for a loud noise complaint. The deputies responded and found loud music playing at approx. 1:30am. Due to multiple complaints on this address for the same issue the resident was issued a municipal ordinance citation for noise violation.

#### **Item #2**

Oct. 3rd, at approx. 10:00pm, Deputy R. Wagner and multiple Brown County Deputies were dispatched to the roundabout at Libal St and Allouez Ave for a report of an intoxicated male jumping in and out of traffic. The male was found and taken into custody. The adult male was cited for Sudden Pedestrian Movement into Traffic and Disorderly Conduct.

#### **Item #3**

Oct. 5<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 8:30pm, Deputy K. Mason and multiple other deputies were sent to the intersection of East River Dr at Hoffman Rd for a welfare check on 2 intoxicated adult males. Deputy Mason and deputies were able to locate the 2 individuals. Both individuals were taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail. One male was charged with Possession of Narcotic Drugs and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. The other male was found to be in violation of his probation and was charged with Bail-Jumping.

#### **Item #4**

Oct. 15th, Deputy Brown and Deputy K. Milks were sent to the 500 block area of St. Marys Blvd. for a report of a suspicious situation. The female caller was calling dispatch for a cab and was very upset. It was unknown if a disturbance was occurring at that time. Deputies arrived and observed an unoccupied vehicle parked in the middle of the road. The female complainant was then located the female driver at a near by residence. The female had knocked on a resident's door asking for help and the resident let her inside. The deputies observed signs that the female had been drinking. A field sobriety test was performed and the female was taken into custody for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup>.

#### **Item #5**

Oct. 16th, Deputy Brown was on routine patrol in Green Isle Park after the park closed at 10pm. Deputy Brown came upon a suspicious vehicle in one of the parking lots. Deputy Brown identified the subjects inside the vehicle to inform them the park was closed. While speaking with the subjects Deputy Brown smelled an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The vehicle was searched and the female occupant admitted to possessing THC. The female was issued a municipal citation for Possession of a Controlled Substance.

#### **Item #6**

Oct. 27th, Deputy Brown performed a traffic stop at approx. 12:30pm on Hoffman Rd near Bitters Ct. Upon speaking with the female operator, Deputy Brown smelled a strong odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The female was cooperative and honest handing over contraband to Deputy Brown. The vehicle was search and more contraband was located. Municipal citations issued to female for Operating After Suspension,

Possession of a Controlled Substance, and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. All evidence properly sealed and entered at the Brown County Sheriff's Office evidence room.

**Item #7**

Oct. 30<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Wagner was sent to assist Sgt. T. Johnson on a traffic stop in the area of Garland St and Clay St. Sgt. Johnson observed injuries to the operator. An investigation was completed resulting in a male party being taken into custody at an address on the 1300 block of S. Van Buren St. The male was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Battery and DVO Disorderly Conduct.

**Item #8**

Nov. 4<sup>th</sup>, Deputy A. Adams was sent to the McCormick Home, located at 212 Iroquois Ave, for a resident who did not report back to the facility after leaving for 24 hours. Deputies were unable to contact or locate the resident at this time. A silver alert notification was placed out state wide to locate the individual. The resident later came back to the facility on his own later that afternoon. The silver alert was canceled and Deputy A. Wysocki responded to the McCormick Home. Deputy Wysocki was able to speak with the resident and verify his welfare.

**Item #9**

Nov. 5<sup>th</sup>, Deputy J. Rousseau and multiple deputies were sent to an address on the 800 block of E. Briar Ln. for a report of a physical disturbance that was over with. The complainant/victim was reporting a male suspect was physical and at one point had pulled out a knife threatening the victim. Deputies were able to speak with the suspect and take him into custody peacefully. The suspect was transported to the Brown County Jail on a charge of DVO Battery, DVO Disorderly Conduct, and Intimidation of Witness.

**Item #10**

Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 2:00am, Deputy Brown performed a traffic stop on a vehicle for traveling at a high rate of speed. Deputy Brown reports the vehicle did eventually attempt to briefly elude Deputy Brown's attempt to perform the traffic stop. The vehicle did pull over and while speaking with the operator Deputy Brown could smell an odor of intoxicants. Field sobriety tests were completed and the operator was taken into custody for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup>. It was learned the operator had multiple local warrants for his arrest. The operator was transported to the Brown County Jail on these warrants. The operator was issued citations for OWI 2<sup>nd</sup>, Exceeding Speed Zones, Operating after Revocation, Failure to Yield/Stop for Emergency Vehicle, and Minor Transport of Intoxicants in Motor Vehicle.

**Item #11**

Nov. 6<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Wysocki was sent to the Bruss Supportive Community Living, located at 2461 Brenner Pl for a report of theft and criminal damage to property. Deputy Wysocki arrived and obtained a statement from the victim. The victim reported someone had broken into medicine cabinet. No suspects identified at this time. A report was completed and forwarded to the Investigative Unit.

**Item #12**

Nov. 9<sup>th</sup>, Deputy A. Ebel and multiple deputies were sent to the area of the 700 block of E. Allouez Ave. for a report of an active physical disturbance involving approx. 10 people. An on-site investigation was completed resulting in two female parties being arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail for Disorderly Conduct.

**Item #13**

Nov. 11<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Brown and multiple deputies were sent to an address on the 1300 block of S Van Buren for a physical disturbance in progress. Deputies arrived and took one female party into custody. The female was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Battery and DVO Disorderly Conduct.

**Item #14**

Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 2:30am, Sgt. Johnson was investigating a suspicious vehicle near the intersection of Hastings St. near S. Webster Ave. Sgt. Johnson located a male subject near the vehicle who was uncooperative. After an investigation and attempting to pat the subject down for weapons the subject attempted to flee. The subject was tackled to the ground and taken into custody. The subject admitted to having marijuana in his pocket. The subject was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of Resisting/Obstructing an Officer and Possession of THC.

**Item #15**

Nov. 15<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Wysocki and Sgt. J. Pamerter were sent to the Allouez BP Quick Stop, located at 2203 S Webster Ave., for a report of a Male/Female physical disturbance that occurred in the parking lot. It was reported the male was walking away from the parking lot. Deputies arrived and were able to locate the male suspect. An investigation was completed resulting in the male suspect being arrested. The male suspect was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Disorderly Conduct and Bail Jumping.

**Item #16**

Nov. 17<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Ebel was flagged down by a citizen in the parking lot of the Shell Gas station of Webster Ave and Hastings St. The citizen/victim reported to Deputy Ebel that a M/B suspect had just entered his unlocked vehicle, stole his GPS unit, and left on a bicycle. Deputy Ebel observed the suspect riding a bicycle northbound on Webster Ave heading in the City of Green Bay. The suspect was told to stop his bike but refused to do so. Multiple deputies were dispatched to help search the area. The suspect was last observed crossing Mason St. near Webster Ave. Deputy Ebel later returned to the scene and was able to locate the GPS unit behind the gas station that was apparently ditched by the suspect. Property returned to owner and incident report completed.

**Item #17**

Nov. 24<sup>th</sup>, Deputy Rousseau was dispatched to the Green Bay Correctional Institution (GBCI), located at 2833 Riverside Dr., for a report of a visitor at the prison having drugs on them. Deputy Rousseau arrived and spoke with the female suspect. The suspect admitted to bringing THC into the prison. The suspect was arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail on a charge of Possession with Intent to Deliver-THC.

**Item #18**

Nov. 30<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 4:30am, Deputy Brown observed a vehicle parked in the parking lot after hours at East Lawn Park, located at 1515 Boyd St. Deputy Brown approached the vehicle and found a male suspect sleeping inside the vehicle. While speaking with suspect Deputy Brown could smell an odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. The suspect was questioned and admitted to having marijuana in the vehicle. The suspect handed the marijuana over to Deputy Brown at this time. The vehicle was searched and nothing else of evidentiary value was located. The suspect was issued municipal citations for Possession of a Controlled Substance and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.
