WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION?

A neighborhood association by definition is neighbors living within a designated area of the Village who are concerned about issues affecting their neighborhood and who have decided to work together to protect and ensure a better social, economic, and business climate in their neighborhood.

The purpose of a neighborhood association is to act as a voice for the neighborhood residents, an official link to local government and the larger community. Many neighborhoods find that by banding together and forming a neighborhood association, they are better able to meet the collective needs of the neighborhood.

Keeping babies safe has always been a top priority of parents. Are you prepared if something happened to your baby such as a medical emergency? Most parents feel that they are somewhat prepared and have probably read materials on how to keep their babies safe.

Response times of the Emergency Medical Services to respond to an emergency is statistically six or more minutes in urban areas and much longer in rural areas. Going without oxygen for 6+ minutes could be deadly for anyone. Irreversible brain damage can happen in as little as five minutes. Wouldn't you want to know what to do for your baby in a medical emergency? Here are some topics that you should have medical training in for an infant;

- CPR
- Choking
- Fever
- Bleeding
- Burns
- Poison

We all know that prevention is the best way to prevent any accident. If we don't take the proper steps to prevent accidents are they really accidents? Take the proper precautions to safeguard your home for infants;

- Put child-proof devices on all cupboards and cabinets that contain chemicals that your baby could get into.
 - Put covers on your electrical sockets.
- Take extra caution when bathing infants. Take note of the water temperature to avoid scald injuries and NEVER leave a baby alone in the bathtub.
 - Place baby gates at the top of stairways.
 - Keep an extremely watchful eye on infants.

It would be a good idea that individuals (family, friends, babysitters/daycare) who care for your baby also be qualified and trained in the above topics and have safeguarded their homes for your baby as well

- ***January 13th: Deputy Vogel responded to Webster Avenue Market for a theft report. The caller reported observing a female place items into her purse and then leave the store without paying for the items. Employees were able to get the female's license plate number. Deputy Vogel was not able to immediately locate the suspect. Report completed and forwarded to the Investigative Division for follow up.***
- ***January 19th: Deputy Vogel responded to an address in the 1200 block of S. Irwin Ave for a damage to property report. The caller reported that it appeared that someone had damaged the door to the residence attempting to gain entry. It appeared that no entry was made to the residence. No suspects at his time.***
- ***January 21st: Deputy Vogel responded to CVS pharmacy for a retail theft complaint. The caller reported two suspects stealing cosmetics. The suspects fled when confronted by store employees. Employees did get the license plate number of the suspect vehicle. Deputy Vogel to view surveillance footage and attempt to locate suspects.***
- ***In the month of January Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 558 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 162 Traffic Stops, 51 traffic crashes, 20 disturbances, and 21 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On January 6, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for a registration violation on Hastings St. near Irwin Ave. The driver was found to have warrants for his arrest and was intoxicated. The driver was arrest for OWI and the outstanding warrants.

Item #2

On January 11, Deputy Knepfel and other Deputies responded to an address in the 3300 block of East River Dr. for a disturbance between two intoxicated male parties. After interviewing those involved one of the male parties was arrested for disorderly conduct and battery.

Item #3

On January 13, Deputy Winistorfer conducted a traffic stop on Libal St near Greene Ave for speeding. The driver of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and arrested for 2nd offense OWI.

Item #4

On January 16, Deputy Shield, Deputy Loppnow and other Deputies responded to an address on Libal St. for a report a female that had come to the house asking for assistance. The female appeared to have been beat up. After speaking to the female Deputies determined that the female was involved in a disturbance with her boyfriend at a nearby residence. The boyfriend had left the scene. While interviewing the female the male was located driving in the neighborhood. The male was stopped and arrested on charges of disorderly conduct, battery, false imprisonment, and strangulation/suffocation.

Item #5

On January 21, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Campbell responded to an address in the 300 block of Gwynn St to attempt to locate a female with warrants for her arrest. The female was located, arrested, and transported to jail without incident.

Item #6

On January 23, Deputy Knepfel and other Deputies responded to an address in the 500 block of Greene Ave for a report of a disturbance. Deputies made contact with those involved and after interviews arrested a female party for battery.

Item #7

On January 25, Deputy Cleven responded to an address in the 500 block of Allouez Ave for a harassment complaint. After interviewing the victim and observing numerous obscene text messages Deputy Cleven and another Deputy located the suspect and arrested him. The suspect has been previously warned not to contact the victim.

Item #8

On January 28, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop on Libal St. at Vande Hei Rd. The operator of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and arrested for second offense OWI.
