The Village of Allouez is promoting the formation of Neighborhood Associations throughout the Village of Allouez.

WHAT IS A NEIGHBORHOOD ASSOCIATION?

A neighborhood association by definition is neighbors living within a designated area of the Village who are concerned about issues affecting their neighborhood and who have decided to work together to protect and ensure a better social, economic, and business climate in their neighborhood.

The purpose of a neighborhood association is to act as a voice for the neighborhood residents, an official link to local government and the larger community. Many neighborhoods find that by banding together and forming a neighborhood association, they are better able to meet the collective needs of the neighborhood.

Keeping babies safe has always been a top priority of parents. Are you prepared if something happened to your baby such as a medical emergency? Most parents feel that they are somewhat prepared and have probably read materials on how to keep their babies safe.

Response times of the Emergency Medical Services to respond to an emergency is statistically six or more minutes in urban areas and much longer in rural areas. Going without oxygen for 6+ minutes could be deadly for anyone. Irreversible brain damage can happen in as little as five minutes. Wouldn't you want to know what to do for your baby in a medical emergency? Here are some topics that you should have medical training in for an infant;

- CPR
- Choking
- Fever
- Bleeding
- Burns
- Poison

We all know that prevention is the best way to prevent any accident. If we don't take the proper steps to prevent accidents are they really accidents? Take the proper precautions to safeguard your home for infants;

- Put child-proof devices on all cupboards and cabinets that contain chemicals that your baby could get into.
 - Put covers on your electrical sockets.
- Take extra caution when bathing infants. Take note of the water temperature to avoid scald injuries and NEVER leave a baby alone in the bathtub.
 - Place baby gates at the top of stairways.
 - Keep an extremely watchful eye on infants.

It would be a good idea that individuals (family, friends, babysitters/daycare) who care for your baby also be qualified and trained in the above topics and have safeguarded their homes for your baby as well

- ***January 9th: Deputy Giesler responded to an address in the 2000 block of Schroeder Lane for an attempted burglary into a house. The complainant reported it appeared someone had attempted entry by the basement window. It was reported the suspect never gain entry into the house. No evidence was left on scene and this incident was documented.***
- ***January 21st: Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 1600 block of Rustic Oaks Ct for a fraud report. The caller reported that his elderly father received a phone call stating there was a virus on his computer and they had to access it. The father gave the unknown suspects permission and to install something onto the computer. The complainant and Deputy Mleziva later called the suspect company "PC Experts" but were unable to obtain any further information as the people appeared to be from a different country. Unknown what information was stolen from the victim's computer. Incident report completed at this time with unknown suspects.***
- ***January 29th: Deputy Rousseau responded to Royal Cleaners at 2307 S Webster Ave for a theft complaint. The complainant reported a tool box located inside the store was broken into and items were dumped out. At the time of the report nothing was believed to be missing. An incident report was completed. There are unknown suspects at this time.***
- ***In the month of January 2016 Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 590 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 185 Traffic Stops, 31 traffic crashes, 17 disturbances, and 38 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On January 8, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle in the parking lot of Austin's The Original. The driver was found to have warrants for her arrest. The driver was arrest for outstanding warrant.

Item #2

On January 12, Deputy Fameree and Deputy Z. Roush responded to an address in the 1200 block of Bismarck St. for a disturbance. After interviewing those involved one of the female parties was arrested for DVO disorderly conduct and criminal damage to property.

Item #3

On January 12, Deputy Fameree and DEO Vogel responded to an address in the 200 block of E Mission Rd to attempt to locate a female with a warrant for her arrest. The female was located, arrested, and transported to jail without incident.

Item #4

On January 19, Deputy Giesler and DEO Vogel responded to an address in the 300 block of Floral Dr to attempt to locate a female with warrants for her arrest. The female was located, arrested, and transported to jail without incident.

Item #5

On January 21, Deputy Fameree responded to the Green Bay Correctional Institution for a report of battery by an inmate to a correctional officer. Deputy Fameree obtained a statement from the victim and will be forwarding assault charges.

Item #6

On January 22, Deputy Mason, Deputy Nerat, and other deputies responded to an address in the 500 block of Beaupre St for a physical disturbance. Both parties were intoxicated. A female party was arrested and booked into jail on a charge DVO Disorderly Conduct.

Item #8

On January 23, Deputy Rousseau responded to an address in the 100 block of Detrie Dr for a report of a suspicious situation. The complainant reported 2 individuals came into his house for a utility issue. The complainant stated nothing was stolen from the house but was concerned this was a scam. Deputy Rousseau later identified 2 individuals working for "Weed Man" and who were attempting to sell products. This incident was documented but no further police assistance was needed.
