Safety Concerns for Snow Removal

So I ask at this time if you are on any street in the Village of Allouez and see a resident removing snow from their driveways, please slow down and attempt to safely move as far over to the left as you can. Hopefully this will avoid any dangerous situations and prevent anyone from being struck.

January and February are usually the coldest time of year for us in Wisconsin. Cold temperatures are not only hard on our bodies, but can be tough on our cars as well. Many of us have experienced, or will experience, some type of cold weather related vehicle breakdown during our lives. Proper vehicle maintenance, such as ensuring correct fluid levels and maintaining at least a half a tank of gas in your vehicle, will help you to avoid a breakdown.

Everyone should have a cold-weather emergency kit in their vehicle in the winter. Here are some things your kit should contain:

- * Flashlight with extra batteries
- * Battery powered radio to hear the weather forecast or any emergency announcements
 - * Some heavy blankets
 - * Extra gloves and hat, heavy sweatshirts and socks
- * Small snow shovel and kitty litter. This can be used for added traction in the snow.
 - * Non perishable foods for energy and bottled water
 - * Jumper cables
 - * A tow strap
 - * Warning light or road flares
- * Water-proof matches or lighter and a candle in a coffee can
 - * Snow scraper/brush
 - * First Aid Kit
 - * Chemical heat packs

If you should happen to get stranded, your best bet is to stay put and call for help on a cell phone. Here are some more tips:

- * Do not leave the car unless help is visible within 100 yards
 - * Do not eat snow (it lowers your body temperature)
- * Raise the hood and display something bright on the antenna
- * To keep warm, run your car engine 10 minutes every hour
- * Keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning

- ***January 9th: Deputy K. Mason responded to an address on the 1900 block of Libal St. for a report of theft. The victim reported a person had taken their credit card without their permission and used it to make an unauthorized purchase. The credit card was later returned. Deputy Mason obtained a statement and completed an incident report. Follow up on this incident is being conducted by the Brown County Sheriff's Office Investigative Unit.***
- ***January 11th: Deputy M. Rukamp responded to an address in the 100 block of Kenney St. for a report of Fraud. The caller reported that there was an unknown credit card charge of over \$5,000 to a local retail store. No suspects at his time. Statement obtained and report completed.***
- ***January 15th: Deputy J. Rusk and Deputy C. Resch responded to an address on the 300 block of Allouez Ave. for a house on fire. The Green Bay Metro Fire Department and deputies evacuated the house and notified next door neighbors. GB Metro Fire completing investigation and report on the fire.***
- ***In the month of January, deputies responded to or initiated approximately 550 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 158 Traffic Stops, 24 traffic crashes, 24 welfare checks, and 34 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On January 1st, Deputy Mason conducted a traffic stop on Libal St near STH 172 for a vehicle with a loud exhaust system. Deputy Mason detected an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The vehicle was searched and a green leafy substance was located. The operator of the vehicle was issued citations for Possession of THC and Operating a Motor Vehicle without Insurance. Written warning issued for failure to maintain exhaust.

Item #2

On January 2nd, Deputy Mason was dispatched to the Allouez Village Hall to meet a victim who wanted to report a disturbance that occurred in the 1300 block of Garland St. on Dec. 29th. Deputy Mason took a statement from the victim. The suspect was located and taken into custody. The suspect was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Battery, Strangulation, and Disorderly Conduct.

Item #3

On January 5th, Deputy Brown and multiple Brown County Sheriff Office deputies were sent to an address on the 1300 block of S. Van Buren St. for a report of a physical disturbance in progress. Deputies responded and took a female into custody. The female was transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of DVO Battery, Disorderly Conduct, and Criminal Trespassing. *DEO Vogel later issued the tenant at this location a municipal ordinance citation for Maintaining a Nuisance Property for this incident and past incidents.

Item #4

On January 15th, Sgt. T. Johnson performed a traffic stop on Allouez Ter at S Monroe Ave. for a vehicle speeding. The operator got out of his vehicle and notified Sgt. Johnson he was in no condition to be driving. Sgt. Johnson observed signs of intoxication coming from the operator. Deputy Delebreaux, who was currently working for

the WI OWI Task Force, responded and performed field sobriety tests. The operator was taken into custody for 1st Offense Operating While Intoxicated (OWI).

Item #5

On January 21st, Deputy Baudry and multiple deputies were dispatched to the area of East River Dr. at Karl St. for a reckless driver reportedly doing cheerios in the roadway. The operator was located and taken into custody on charges of 2nd Offense OWI, Operating After Revocation, Failure to Keep Vehicle Under Control, Failure to Install Ignition Interlock Device, and Operating Motor Vehicle without Insurance.

Item #6

On January 24th, Deputy A. Wysocki performed a traffic stop on a vehicle on Webster Ave at St. Joseph St. A record check showed the operator of the vehicle had a warrant out for his arrest. Deputy D. Fameree then arrived on scene to assist. The operator was taken into custody for the warrant. The vehicle was searched due to a smell of marijuana coming from the vehicle. A green plant like material was located. The operator was charged with Possession of THC and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Item #7

On January 27th, Deputy Mleziva was performing a routine park check at the Optimist Park. Deputy Mleziva observed a suspicious vehicle and requested Deputy Fameree to respond and assist him in checking on the vehicle. Deputies spoke to the operator and noticed an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle. The operator was honest stating he had been smoking in the vehicle. The operator was issued a citation for Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. I would like to take this opportunity to thank Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Fameree for their efforts in this matter in showing park checks are important.

Item #8

On January 27th, Deputy Fameree and Deputy B. Dernbach were dispatched to the Green Bay Correctional Institution (GBCI) for a report of 2 prison guards being assaulted by inmates. Statements were obtained from the two prison guards and a report was completed by Deputy Dernbach. A charge of Battery by Prisoner are being forwarded on the two inmates.

Item #9

On January 28th, Deputy Milkie and Deputy Mleziva were dispatched to an address on the 1500 block of Webster Ave. for a welfare check on a male suspect. Deputies arrived and located the suspect. A record check showed there was a warrant out for the suspect and he was taken into custody. A thorough investigation was completed by the deputies and the suspect was found to be in violation of a court order. The suspect was transported to the Brown County Jail on his warrant and a charge of Violation of a Domestic Abuse Injunction was forwarded to the District Attorney's Office.
