January 2015 2015 Allouez Deputies

With the new year we have a couple of new Deputies working in Allouez. Each year Deputies have the opportunity to sign up to work different shifts and/or areas, so it's very common to see new Deputies in Allouez every year. Deputies work a six days on three days off rotation.

Deputy Randy VonHaden will remain the primary dayshift officer working 6am-2pm.

Deputy Joe Mleziva will remain the primary PM shift officer working 2pm-10pm.

Deputy Jason Vogel will remain the Dayshift/PM shift relief working 3 days on PM shift and then 3 days on dayshift to cover for Mleziva's and VonHaden's days off.

Deputy David Knepfel will be primary night shift officer working 10pm-6am. David started with the Brown County Sheriff's Office in March of 2014. David attended UW Oshkosh and the NWTC Law Enforcement Academy. Before joining the Sheriff's Office he worked part time for two smaller Police Departments and in the manufacturing industry.

Deputy Nate Winistorfer will be the night shift relief officer working in Allouez on Deputy Knepfel's days off. Nate attended NWTC for Criminal Justice/Law Enforcement. Nate previously worked part time for the Edgar, WI Police Dept. and full time for the Waupaca, WI Police Dept. before joining the Brown County Sheriff's Office in April 2012. Nate has also served in the WI Army National Guard for 7 years and is currently a sergeant.

Snowblowers can be easier on your back and save precious time. Unfortunately, the improper use of snowblowers is responsible for almost 6,000 emergency room visits and 1000 amputations per year in the US, as reported by the Center for Disease Control and Prevention.

Individuals that are new to snowblower use or are operating one for the first time of the year are most prone to a snowblower accident. Here are some tips to prevent a snowblower injury;

- **NEVER try to clean the auger or discharge chute with your hand. This is the most common way to be injured by a snowblower.**
 - Keep your hands and feet clear of all moving parts.
 - If you need to clean an auger or discharge chute, shut the snowblower engine off and clear it with the special shovel that some new machines come with or a broom handle, not your hand.
 - Make sure that the discharge chute is aimed away from people and pets.
 - Be careful of hot engine parts such as the muffler that can quickly cause a burn.
 - Never add fuel to a snowblower that is running.
 - Avoid wearing loose clothing such as scarves that could become entangled in the snowblower's moving parts.
 - Never leave your machine running unattended.

Snowblowers are meant to make our lives easier, not to hurt us. Take the extra time this year to use it safely. Your hands, fingers and toes will thank you for it.

Item #1

On December 6, Deputy Shield conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for speeding on Webster Ave. at Allouez Ave. A passenger in the vehicle was found to have a warrant for his arrest and taken to jail for the warrants. The driver was issued a written warning for speeding.

Item #2

On December 10, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for a defective headlamp on Libal St. at Beaupre St. A passenger in the vehicle was found to have a warrant for her arrest and taken to jail for the warrant. The Driver was issued a citation for operating while suspended and a written warning for the defective headlamp.

Item #3

On December 11, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop on East River Dr. at Allouez Ave. The driver of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and arrested for OWI.

Item #4

On December 12, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to the CVS Pharmacy for a report of a possible robbery in progress. Upon arrival it appeared that nothing was happening. Deputies then made contact with the clerk who pointed out a male party and

said he had a gun. The male was taken into custody and no weapon was located. After talking to witnesses and viewing the surveillance it was apparent the male did make gestures as if he had a gun in his coat pocket. The male was arrested for Robbery.

Item #5

On December 15, Deputy Loppnow responded to an address in the 300 block of Beaupre St. to serve a citation. Upon the suspect opening the door to the residence it was apparent that there was marijuana use happening in the residence. After checking the residence the suspect and his wife were issued citations for possession of marijuana. The male was also issued the original citation.

Item #6

On December 19, Deputy Loppnow conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle driving without headlamps at night. Upon contact with the driver the odor of burned marijuana was apparent. The vehicle was searched and both occupants were cited for possession of marijuana. The driver was also cited for operating without headlamps at night.

Item #7

On December 20, Deputy Shield conducted a traffic stop in the 500 block of Kalb St. The driver and passenger of the vehicle were found to have warrants for their arrest. Both were arrested for the warrants. The driver was cited for operating while suspended and the passenger was cited for possession of drug paraphernalia.

Item #8

On December 20, Deputy Nerat and Deputy Dernbach responded to an address on Karl St. to attempt to locate a male party with numerous warrants for his arrest from the Village of Allouez and Village of Howard Municipal Courts. The male was located and arrested for the warrants.
