Allouez Deputies for 2017

Each year Brown County Sheriff's Office Deputies have the opportunity to pick what shift or area they want to work. Deputies work a six days on-three days off rotation. As in past years we will have some new faces working in Allouez for 2017.

-Deputy JJ Rusk will replace J. Rousseau as the primary deputy on the day shift. Deputy Rusk grew up in the Kaukauna area and graduated from UW Stevens Point. Deputy Rusk worked on the boat patrol for the Menominee County Sheriff's Office prior to getting hired here in March, 2016.

-Deputy Kyle Mason will remain at the regular PM, 2pm-10pm, officer. I would like to thank both Deputy Mason and Deputy Brown for their dedicated performance in Allouez this past year and signing with us again!

-As mentioned, Deputy Colin Brown remains the primary deputy on the night shift, 10pm-6am.

-Deputy Al Wysocki will be the PM relief officer and fills in for Deputy Mason on his days off. Deputy Wysocki grew up in Marinette County and graduated from UW-Stevens Point. Deputy Wysocki has worked for the City of Houston Police Department and the City of Wasilla Police Department in Alaska before moving back to Wisconsin in 2008, where he worked for the City of De Pere Police Department. In June of 2016, Deputy Wysocki left the De Pere Police Department and started working for the Brown County Sheriff's Office. On a side note, Al's promising career in football was cut short by a knee injury and, according to him, he hopes to become a salesman after retirement in law enforcement.

-Deputy Jeffrey Baudry will be the night's relief officer when Deputy Brown is off. Deputy Baudry grew up in the Fon du Lac and graduated from UW Oshkosh. Deputy Baudry served in the U.S. Army with the 82nd Airborne Division and Wisconsin National Guard reaching the rank of Sergeant; with one deployment to Afghanistan.

-Deputy Meredith Rukamp will be the AM relief officer when Deputy Rusk is on his days off. Deputy Rukamp is originally from the Green Bay area. She attended college at UW Whitewater earning a Bachelor's degree in Biology. After college she worked in the Health Care field for several years before pursuing a career in Law Enforcement. Deputy Rukamp began her police career in 2014 with the Grand Chute Police Department and began employment with the Brown County Sheriff's Office as a Patrol Deputy in June 2016.

I would like to thank Deputies Justin Rousseau and Robert Wagner for all their hard work in Allouez this past year and wish them well with their 2017 Brown County Sheriff's Office assignments.

January and February are usually the coldest time of year for us in Wisconsin. Cold temperatures are not only hard on our bodies, but can be tough on our cars as well. Many of us have experienced, or will experience, some type of cold weather related vehicle breakdown during our lives. Proper vehicle maintenance, such as ensuring correct fluid levels and maintaining at least a half a tank of gas in your vehicle, will help you to avoid a breakdown.

Everyone should have a cold-weather emergency kit in their vehicle in the winter. Here are some things your kit should contain:

- * Flashlight with extra batteries
- * Battery powered radio to hear the weather forecast or any emergency announcements
 - * Some heavy blankets
 - * Extra gloves and hat, heavy sweatshirts and socks
- * Small snow shovel and kitty litter. This can be used for added traction in the snow.
 - * Nonperishable foods for energy and bottled water
 - * Jumper cables
 - * A tow strap
 - * Warning light or road flares
- * Water-proof matches or lighter and a candle in a coffee can
 - * Snow scraper/brush
 - * First Aid Kit
 - * Chemical heat packs

If you should happen to get stranded, your best bet is to stay put and call for help on a cell phone. Here are some more tips:

- * Do not leave the car unless help is visible within 100 yards
- * Do not eat snow (it lowers your body temperature)
- * Raise the hood and display something bright on the antenna
- * To keep warm, run your car engine 10 minutes every hour
- * Keep the exhaust pipe clear of snow to avoid carbon monoxide poisoning

- ***December 12th:** Deputy Wysocki responded to a residence on the 1100 block of Garland St for a fraud complaint. The caller reported an unknown suspect had obtained their credit card and pin numbers. Deputy Wysocki obtained a written statement and completed a report that will be forwarded to the Brown County Investigative Unit.*
- ***December 15th:** Deputy Mason met a female victim at the Village of Allouez Hall for a theft report. The female was reporting prescription pills were stolen out of her vehicle while parked in the parking lot at Wells Fargo Bank on Webster Ave. The victim provided a suspect name at this time. Report completed by Deputy Mason.*
- ***December 17th:** Deputy Brown responded to an address on the 600 block of Sunrise Ln for a theft report. The victim was reporting someone had entered his house and stole a ring. Suspect names were provided. Written statement obtained and report completed.*
- ***December 18th:** Deputy Mason responded to an address in the 800 block of Derby Ln. for a fraud complaint. The caller reported fraudulent charges were made on his credit card account. No suspects at this time. Statement obtained and report forwarded to the investigative unit.*
- ***On December 23^d:** Deputy C. Resch was dispatched to Chase Bank, 2635 Libal St, for a fraud report. Notes in the call indicated the fraud occurred yesterday when a male withdrew money from someone else's account using a false identifying document. Written statement obtained from victim and bank teller. Video surveillance footage obtained. Report forwarded to investigative unit.*
- ***In the month of December, Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 536 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 111 traffic stops, 44 traffic crashes, 14 disturbances, and 32 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On December 3rd, Deputy C. Brown was dispatched to an address on the 100 block of Whitney St for a harassment complaint. The complainant reported this is an ongoing issue. The suspect was repeatedly ordered to stop contacting the complainant/victim, charges are being referred on the suspect for harassment.

Item #2

On December 3rd, at approx. 10:53pm, Deputy J. Raska and B. Sanborn performed a traffic stop on S. Webster Ave. at Kalb St. Both deputies were working the OWI Grant Patrol offered by the State of Wisconsin. Due to the occupants acting suspicious, a drug detection K9 officer was requested to search the vehicle.

Item #3

On Dec. 6th, at approx. 8:20pm, Deputy Ebel stopped a vehicle on Riverside Dr and STH 172 due to the registered owner having multiple Brown County Sheriff's Office warrants. The operator sped up attempting to elude Deputy Ebel's traffic stop. A chase ensued with multiple Brown County deputies dispatched to the area. The case was terminated by supervisors due to public safety concerns. The vehicle was located shortly after termination and found abandoned. A K9 unit searched the area but was unable to locate

the suspect. The vehicle was impounded at this time. A charge is pending on the suspect for Knowingly Fleeing an Officer.

Item #4

On Dec. 7th, Deputy Rousseau responded to the Midway Mobil gas station on Webster Ave. for a report of retail theft. It was reported a Male/Black, approx. 15years old, entered the store and stole cigars. Deputy Rousseau arrived and completed the report. It should be noted this is an on-going problem for this gas station. Three citations/arrests have been made to date for this similar crime. Investigation on going at this time.

Item #5

On Dec. 11th, at approx. 2:30am, Deputy Brown conducted a traffic stop on Garland St at Irwin Ave for a vehicle deviating from their lane of traffic while on Webster Ave. While speaking with the operator Deputy Brown could smell an odor of intoxicants. Deputy Brown had the female operator perform field sobriety tests and subsequently failed. The operator was taken into custody on Operating while Intoxicated 1st Offence and for deviation from their lane of traffic.

Item #6

On Dec. 22nd, Deputy Resch was sent to an address on the 300 block of Beaupre St. for a harassment complaint. The victim reported this has been an ongoing matter and there is a no contact order between the victim and the suspect. Report completed and charges forwarded to the Brown County District Attorney's Office for review.

Item #7

On Dec. 24th, Deputy G. Gleason performed a traffic stop on Riverside Dr at St Joseph St for speeding and having a headlamp out. Deputy Gleason observed the operator's eyes were red and glossy with an odor of intoxicates coming from his breath. Field Sobriety Tests were performed with the operator failing the tests. The operator was taken into custody for OWI 1st and later released to a responsible party.

Item #8

On Dec. 27th, at approx. 12:50am, Deputy Brown was performing a park check in Green Isle Park when he observed a vehicle parked on the roadway. All village parks are closed from 10pm to 6am. Deputy Brown performed a traffic stop to identify the subjects inside. While speaking with the subjects a strong odor of marijuana was detected. The occupants were eventually cooperative and handed over a green leafy substance and paraphernalia. The operator of the vehicle was issued citations for Possession of a Controlled Substance and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Item #9

On Dec. 30th, Deputy J. Milkie performed a traffic stop on a vehicle on Libal St at Vande Hei Rd for an inoperable break light. While speaking with the operator a strong odor of marijuana was coming from inside the vehicle. The vehicle was searched and a green leafy substance was located. Charges of Possession of THC with Intent to Deliver and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia are being forwarded to the Brown County District Attorney's Office.
