### Allouez Tidbitz

-There were several reports of thefts from vehicles in June. All of the incidents involved valuables being taken from unlocked vehicles overnight.

-There continues to be numerous reports of scam phone calls throughout Brown County. Please remember to never give out any personal information over the phone or send money to anyone unless you are 100% sure of who you are dealing with.

-In June local Law Enforcement Agencies began participating in Speed Task Force operations. Participating agencies get together and focus on specific area to conduct speed enforcement. In June there was a Speed Task Force operation that focused on Allouez and Bellevue. There will be several more operations in Allouez and Bellevue in July. So if you see a squad car from a neighboring Agency such as Hobart/Lawrence Police Dept. in Allouez they are likely here as part of the Speed Task Force.

At some point during life's journey, you will find yourself at the scene of a traffic accident. If you choose to stop and help those that are injured, what would you do? Not doing the right things could make things worse. Here are some tips to guide you in the right direction:

- Get the help you need coming to the scene by calling 911. You will have to describe the scene for the dispatcher so that the correct help is dispatched. 911 dispatch may also guide you through some basic first aid.
- Survey the scene and determine if you are able to safely help the victims without becoming a victim yourself. Be extremely mindful of traffic as many police officers, firefighters, and EMS workers have been killed by passing motorists at an accident scene.
- Approach the victims, say hello and identify yourself. Visually look for injuries as well as ask "what hurts?" Relay that information to the 911 dispatcher.
- **DO NOT** move victims as this could make things much worse. The violent forces of a vehicle accident can easily damage the spinal column. Moving a victim with a spinal injury may cause paralysis.

For those that are driving by an accident scene on the roadway you should;

- **PAY ATTENTION TO DRIVING!** Hitting an emergency responder is easy to do if you're paying more attention to the accident scene than what is in front of the several thousand pound vehicle that you're controlling.
- Slow down. There may be obstacles that you will have to drive around including people.

You can do the most help at an accident scene is getting professional help to the accident through the use of the dispatch center and gathering the necessary information. Remember that your safety is #1.

- *June 10: Deputy Loppnow responded to an address in the 100 block of Beaupre Street for a theft report. The caller reported two steel tubes from a large wind chime stolen from the back yard. No suspects at this time.*
- *June 12th: Deputy Vogel responded to an address in the 500 block of Clover Lane for a theft report. The caller reported their unlocked vehicle being entered overnight and about \$10 in change taken. No suspects at his time.*
- *June 16th: Deputy Loppnow took a report of a theft from a vehicle in the 2400 block of Greenwald St. The caller reported her purse stolen from her unlocked vehicle. No suspects at this time.*
- *June 16th: Deputy Mleziva responded to a residence in the 400 block of Dauphin St. for a theft report. The caller reported about \$25 in change stolen from two unlocked vehicles that were in the driveway. No suspects at this time.*
- *July 16th: Deputy Mleziva responded to a residence in the 700 block of Broadview Dr. for a burglary complaint. The caller reported a 55" TV taken from the house. Possible suspect is a contractor that had access to the house. Follow up investigation to be completed.*
- *June 21st: Deputy Knepfel responded to an address in the 1200 block of South Quincy Ave for a theft complaint. The caller reported his stereo equipment stolen from his unlocked vehicle. No suspects at this time.*
- *June 29th: Deputy VonHaden responded to an address in the 1400 block of McCormick Street for a theft report. The caller reported prescription medications stolen from his vehicle sometime overnight.*
- *In the month of June Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 642 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 193 traffic Stops, 38 traffic crashes, 22 disturbances, and 56 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

### **Item #1**

On June 9, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Loppnow responded to New China for a report of customers arguing with employees over price and then taking soda without permission and leaving. Contact with the suspects and employees was made and the food/soda was returned and money refunded. One of the male customers was found to have a warrant for his arrests and arrested for the warrant only.

### **Item #2**

On June 14, Deputies Mleziva and Dernbach responded to a residence in the 1400 block of South Monroe for a report of a disturbance between a male and female. Upon arrival/investigation the male party was arrested for a Probation & Parole and the female was referred for charges of disorderly conduct.

### **Item #3**

On June 23, Deputies responded to Green Isle Park for a report two males fighting near the softball/kickball field. Deputies made contact with the two males. After interviewing them they were both cited for disorderly conduct through the Allouez Municipal Court.

**Item #4**

On June 24, Deputy Winistorfer conducted a traffic stop on East River Drive at Somerset Dr. Two occupants of the vehicle were found to have warrants for their arrest. They were both arrested/jailed on the warrants.

**Item #5**

On June 29, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle for speeding on East River Dr. The operator of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated, operating with a revoked license, and operating a vehicle without an ignition interlock device. The operator was arrested for OWI 3rd.
