-Allouez participated in the prescription pill take back event on 5/16/15. Allouez continues to see a higher number of people turning in unwanted pills than other communities in Brown County.

-On 5-1-15 Deputy Loppnow served a drug related search warrant on McCormick St. The homeowner was cited as a public nuisance and charges for manufacture of marijuana have been forwarded to the Brown County District Attorney's Office.

-On 5-1-15 there was a serious crash on Greene Ave near Libal St. Deputies from throughout Brown County including squads assigned to Bellevue and County sections responded to assist. The investigation following the crash revealed that the operator of the vehicle suffered a serious cardiac related medical event that rendered him unconscious, leading to the crash. The operator of the vehicle did pass away due to the medical condition.

-Other law enforcement agencies in the area have reported an increase in theft from vehicle incidents. With warmer weather it is likely that we too will see an increase in these types of incidents. Please remember to lock your vehicle and remove any valuables from it when parking.

Fireworks are something that many people, kids and adults alike, look forward to year after year. Unfortunately in 2012, emergency rooms across the United States treated an estimated 8,700 people for fireworks related injuries. In 2011 fireworks caused an estimated 17,800 fires, including 1,200 total structure fires, 400 vehicle fires, and 16,200 outside and other fires.

Some facts about the injuries:

- The majority of injuries were to the head and the hands.
- Over half of these injuries were burns.
- A third of fireworks injuries happen to children 5 and under.
- **Over 90% of fireworks injuries treated in hospital emergency rooms involve fireworks that Federal regulations permit consumers to use.**

To keep safe when lighting fireworks this year, follow these guidelines:

- Never allow children to play with or light fireworks.
- If you decide to let your child use a sparkler, make sure that they are constantly supervised and are old enough to understand that they or someone else could get hurt if they are not careful (sparklers burn at 1200 degrees F or higher).
- Never try to relight “dud” fireworks. Leave them alone for 30 minutes before approaching.
- Keep a garden hose nearby just in case of malfunction or fire.
- Maintain a safe distance.
- Always light fireworks on a hard level surface (preferably concrete).
- Avoid alcohol.
- Keep your pets on a leash.

More fires are reported on Independence Day than on any other day of the year and fireworks are responsible for half of these fires. Fireworks can easily cause fires, severe burns, and even death if not careful. Your best bet to stay safe is to attend a fireworks display that is put on by professionals in your town, city, or village.

- ***May 5: Deputy Vogel responded to an address in the 300 block of E Mission Dr. for a damage to property report. The caller reported damage to the detached garage from someone possibly attempting to break in. No suspects at this time.***
- ***May 6th: Deputy Vogel responded to an address on Linck Ct for a theft report. The caller reported their vehicle being entered overnight and a handgun & deposit checks stolen. No suspects at his time.***

- ***In the month of May Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 602 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 206 traffic Stops, 27 traffic crashes, 13 disturbances, and 38 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On May 1, Deputy Loppnow, with the assistance of the Brown County Drug Task Force, served a search warrant at a residence on McCormick St. Equipment used to grow marijuana and marijuana was located at the residence. One suspect was cited as a public nuisance and further charges were referred to the Brown County District Attorney for manufacture of marijuana.

Item #2

On May 3, Deputy Verheyen and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 400 block of Terraview Dr. for a report of a disturbance between a male and female. Upon arrival/investigation the male party was arrested for disorderly conduct and resisting/obstructing an officer.

Item #3

On May 3, Deputies Mleziva and Dow responded to an address in the 600 block of Allouez Ave to attempt to locate a female with a warrant for her arrest from the Allouez Municipal Court. The female was located and arrested for the warrant.

Item #4

On May 6, Deputy Vogel responded to the 800 block of Dauphin St. for a suspicious vehicle/person complaint. Four males had parked their vehicle and walked into the woods in the area. The males were located as they came out of the woods. One of the males was found to be in possession of drug paraphernalia and arrested.

Item #5

On May 9, Deputies responded to an address on Patrick Ct. for a disturbance call. Upon arrival and interviewing the parties involved a male party was arrested for multiple charges.

Item #6

On May 12, Deputy VonHaden conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. near St. Joseph St. The operator of the vehicle was found to have a warrant for her arrest and arrested/jailed for the warrant.

Item #7

On May 16, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to an address on Kendall St. for a disturbance between two females. After locating and interviewing those involved one female was arrested for disorderly conduct, battery, and possession of marijuana.

Item #8

On May 17, Deputy Knepfel and other Deputies responded to an address in the 700 block of Dauphin St. for a report of an unknown male party pounding on the door. The suspect was located and found to be intoxicated. The male was arrested for disorderly conduct and damage to property.

Item #9

On May 27, Deputy Vogel responded to the Prevea Clinic on Webster Ave for a report of a male party beating up a female party in a vehicle. The male suspect left the scene in another vehicle headed North on Webster Ave prior to officer arrival. The male suspect was located a short time later by Green Bay Police Officers and detained. After interviewing two victims the male was arrested for battery, disorderly conduct, and a probation violation.

Item #10

On May 30, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Peterson responded to a residence in the 1400 block of Monroe Ave to attempt to locate a male party with warrants for his arrest. The male party was located and arrested.
