July is usually hot and humid for us in this area and I'm sure this year will be no different. Staying properly hydrated will make a big difference in how well your body will cope with the heat. The average adult loses more than 10 cups of fluid through sweating , breathing, and eliminating waste every day. If you are exercising or are out in high heat, the amount lost will be higher

So the big question is how much do you need to drink per day? The answer to this depends on many factors such as age, sex, weight, climate, and activities that you will perform. Guidelines are constantly changing. In 2004, the Institute of Medicine effectively overruled the 8 glass a day rule - with a new report. They stated a general daily recommendation of 2.7 liters (91 ounces) of total water for women and 3.7 liters (125 ounces) for men. This includes water from all sources (foods and drinks).

Listen to your body and recognize the signs that you may need more fluids. Here are some signs of dehydration;

- * Thirst
- * Dark Urine
- * Dizziness or lightheadedness
- * Muscle cramps
- * Headache
- * Feeling weak or tired

Here's the bottom line. Most of us don't drink enough fluids and it's hard to put an exact number on how much you need. To stay hydrated you need to stay ahead of the fluid loss and plan for it. It is better to have an excess amount to lose than trying to play catch-up. The best advice is to take in fluids consistently throughout the day even when you're not thirsty.

- ***May 9th:*** Deputy VonHaden and other Deputies responded to the CVS Pharmacy on Webster Ave for possible bomb threat. The store manager reported an unknown person calling the store threatening to blow the place up if he didn't receive pre-paid debit cards from the store. It is believed that this was a scam phone call and there was never any actual threat of a bombing. Report completed and sent to the Investigative Division.
- ***May 11th:*** Deputy Reese responded to an address in the 3900 block of East River Drive for a burglary complaint. The caller reported a screen and door being pried open and items missing from the residence. Report completed and sent to the Investigative Division.
- ***May 13th:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to the 400 block of E. Briar Ln. for a theft complaint. The caller reported observing a male in a vehicle take a construction barricade from the street. The barricade was located the next morning at a different location. No suspects at this time.
- ***May 24th:*** Deputy Vogel responded to a residence in the 600 block of Brevoort Ln. for a damage to property complaint. The caller reported that someone sprayed BBQ sauce on a vehicle and sidewalk. The caller did have possible suspect information. Follow up to be completed.
- ***May 30th:*** Deputy Shield responded to an address in the 3500 block of Libal St. for a damage to property complaint. The caller reported finding his mailbox and garbage can in the street. No suspects at this time.
- ***May 31st:*** Deputy Shield responded to an address in the 500 block of Dauphin St. for a theft report. The caller report several items including a phone and Nintendo DS taken from her vehicles. Both vehicles were unlocked. No suspects at this time.
- ***In the month of May Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 641 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 197 traffic stops, 31 traffic crashes, 23 disturbances, and 38 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***
- ***June 1st:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 400 block of Memory Ct. for a theft complaint. The caller reported his vehicle being broken into and a bank envelope containing cash and checks taken. No suspects at this time.
- ***June 22:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 300 block of Broadview Dr. for a theft report. A kids bicycle was reported stolen. No suspects at this time.
- ***June 29:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 3600 block of Glenbrook Ln. for a theft report. The caller reported his wallet being stolen from his vehicle overnight. No suspects at this time.
- ***June 30:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 1200 block of Bismark St. for a theft report. The caller reported a potted plant being stolen overnight. No suspects at this time.

Item #1

On May 2, Deputy Vogel stopped a vehicle on Riverside Dr. near Allouez Ave. for speeding. The operator of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and arrested for 5th offense OWI.

Item #2

On May 4, Deputy Shield responded to the Speedway Gas Station on East Mason St. for an intoxicated male party that claimed to Green Bay Police that he had been car-jacked at gunpoint at the intersection of East River Dr. and Longview Ave. in Allouez. The vehicle was found damaged a short distance away. After questioning the male he was arrested for OWI. The male admitted to driving the car in Allouez and it appeared that he was making up the story about being car-jacked to cover crashing the vehicle.

Item #3

On May 10, Deputy Giesler conducted a traffic stop on a vehicle on Libal St. near HWY 172. Deputy Giesler observed the vehicle drive up the curb and driver over the center line of Libal St. The operator was found to be intoxicated and arrested for OWI-2nd offense. The operator was also found to have a warrant for his arrest from the Green Bay Police Dept. The operator was taken to jail for the warrant and operating while intoxicated charge.

Item #4

On May 10, Deputy Reese and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 300 block of Simonet St. for a report of a disturbance. Deputies made contact with a female who had been involved in a disturbance with another female and reported being hit in the face. The suspect had fled the scene and was not immediately located. On May 11 the victim called back to recant her story and not pursue any charges against the suspect. Report completed and forwarded to the Investigative Division.

Item #5

On May 14, Deputy Loppnow was attending Allouez Court when he observed several juveniles outside the Village Hall smoking from some type of bong. Deputy Loppnow stopped and questioned a juvenile male and juvenile female. The two were found to be skipping school to attend a friend's court appearance. They had been smoking a vapor cigarette with the bong. After contacting their parents the male was cited for daytime loitering violations (truancy) and the female was cited for daytime loitering, possession of tobacco by a minor, and carrying a concealed weapon due to having a large folding knife in her backpack.

Item #6

On May 15, Deputy Mleziva responded to the 2300 block of Libal St. for a complaint of a male possible touching himself inappropriately in his vehicle. The suspect was gone on arrival, but he caller did provide a license plate number of the suspect vehicle. Deputy Mleziva was able to identify and question the suspect based on the license plate. The suspect admitted to inappropriate behavior and was cited for lewd and lascivious behavior.

Item #7

On May 17, Deputy Shield and other Deputies responded to an address on Blackhawk Dr. for an intoxicated male party attempting to get into the house. Deputies made contact with the male outside of the residence. The male was arrested for outstanding warrants.

Item #8

On May 18, Deputies responded to a residence in the 600 block of E. Mission Dr. for a disturbance between a male and female. After interviewing both of the parties that were involved the male was arrested for damage to property and disorderly conduct.

Item #9

On May 31, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 1200 block of Hastings St. for a disturbance between a male and female. Contact was made with both parties and the male party was arrested for disorderly conduct and damage to property.

Item #10

On June 5, Deputy Mleziva went to a residence in the 2200 block of Libal Street to attempt to locate a wanted person. The person was located at the residence and arrested for two outstanding warrants.

Item #11

On June 7, Deputy Loppnow conducted a traffic stop in the 600 block of Greene Ave for expired registration. The driver of the vehicle was found to have warrant for his arrest. The driver was cited for expired registration and operating without insurance as well as arrested for the outstanding warrant.

Item #12

On June 9, Deputies Vogel and Loppnow responded to the Hawthorne Suites for a disturbance between a male and female. The caller was reporting being punched in the face by his wife. After interviewing both parties both the male and female were arrested for domestic violence related charges.

Item #13

On June 13, Deputy Mleziva and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 500 block of Dauphin St. for a disturbance call. Information from dispatch indicated that the disturbance was between a male and his grandparents. Upon arrival all parties were interviewed. The grandson was arrested for damage to property and disorderly conduct.

Item #14

On June 14, Deputy Schield conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. near Alloué Ter. The operator of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and on probation. The operator was arrested for OWI and a probation violation.

Item #15

On June 14, Deputy Giesler conducted a traffic stop on Allouéz Ave at Hawthorne Pl. for an expired registration. The male driver of the vehicle was found to have a warrant for his arrest. The driver was arrested for the warrant and issued several traffic citations.

Item #17

On June 17, Deputy Loppnow and Deputy Kiehnau responded to an address in the 1300 block of McCormick St. to attempt to locate a person wanted on felony charges from Green Bay Police Dept. Detectives. After attempting contact at the residence several times the male was located walking down McCormick St. and arrested.

Item #18

On June 19, Deputy Loppnow conducted a traffic stop for expired registration on W. Allouéz Ave. at Riverside Dr. The driver and passenger in the vehicle were found to have warrants for their arrest. The Driver was issued several traffic citations and the passenger was issued a citation for failure to wear his seatbelt. Both were arrested/jailed on the outstanding warrants.

Item #19

On June 23 (about 4am), Deputy Shield stopped a suspicious person on Libal St. near Allouez Ave. The person was identified and found to have a warrant for his arrest. The person was arrested/jailed for the warrant.

Item #20

On June 25, Deputy Loppnow and other Deputies responded to the Webster Avenue Market for a report of a robbery in progress. Upon arrival the robbery turned out to be a shoplifter that was detained by store employees. The suspect was cited for retail theft.

Item #21

On June 28, Deputy Loppnow and a State Trooper stopped a vehicle on Libal St. at Somerset. The vehicle had been called in by a citizen as a possible intoxicated driver. The driver of the vehicle was arrested by the State Trooper for possession of marijuana and possession of drug paraphernalia.

Item #22

On June 30, Deputy Lemberger stopped the same vehicle from item #21 above on Webster Ave. near STH 172 after observing it swerving and almost hit the concrete barrier on STH 172. The operator was the same individual from the incident on the 28th. Deputy Lemberger was able to get a Drug Recognition Expert to evaluate the driver. The driver was arrested for operating while intoxicated and issued citations through the Allouez Municipal Court for possession of marijuana and drug paraphernalia.
