- There has been an increase in reports of scam phone calls. The call from someone saying they are from the IRS saying you owe them money has been the main one. Please remember to never send anyone money or give out personal information.
- There have also been many reports of tax fraud. When the victim attempts to file their taxes they find that someone has already filed them and took the refund. This reminds us all of how important it is to be careful with our personal information.
- For the past several months the Village has seen very low numbers of property crimes such as theft and damage to property. This can likely be attributed to the cold winter weather. As it warms up we will likely see an increase in these types of crimes. Please do not hesitate to report suspicious activity in your neighborhood.
- The Prescription pill take back program that was sponsored by the DEA has ended. But the State of Wisconsin is making plans to continue the program and continue to have prescription pill take-back events. When more information is available we will attempt to continue the events at the Allouez Village Hall as we have in the past.

It's spring! It's that time of year when the temperatures outside are climbing almost as fast as the number of motorcycles and scooters on the road are increasing. It's been months since we've had to share the road with our two-wheeled friends. Here are some tips to help motorcyclists and scooter riders stay safe;

- Complete a Rider Course that will give you the confidence and skills to ride safely.
- Wear the proper gear such as a helmet, jacket, trousers, gloves, and eye protection. Bright colored and reflective clothing will help others see you.
  - No drinking alcohol and driving.
- Drive defensively because it is much harder to see a motorcycle or scooter. Most motorcycle and scooter riders could attest to the fact that they have had a car pull out in front of them on numerous occasions.
- Sand and gravel are abundant on roads this time of year! Be especially careful on curves and corners.
- The best defense is a good offense. In motorcycle/scooter terms, that means you need to keep your skills polished by practicing, keeping your eyes focused on the road and playing nice with other vehicles.

Everyone who does not ride a motorcycle or scooter this is for you!

- Over 2/3 of motorcycle/scooter crashes involved another vehicle.
- Remember that motorcycles and scooters have all of the privileges of any vehicle on the roadway.
  - Be aware of motorcyclists/scooter riders on the road, changing lanes, at intersections or when they are turning left.
  - Don't follow too close to allow motorcyclists/scooter riders to take evasive actions to avoid debris, potholes, etc.
  - It will take some adjustment for all of us to be more aware of these smaller vehicles so be on the lookout for them.

Remember that almost all accidents are preventable. It's up to you to do your best to prevent one.

- ***March 2nd: Deputy Weiler responded to an address in the 3600 block of Libal St for a burglary report. The caller reported that someone had broken into his storage shed in the back yard and stolen numerous power tools. No suspects at this time.***
- ***March 10th: Deputy Kiehnau responded to Schroeders Flowers for a theft report. The caller reported that their wallet was stolen off the counter at the store. No suspects at his time.***
- ***March 12th: Deputy Vogel and Investigators responded to a residence on Brevoort Ln. for a burglary complaint. The caller reported cash and other items stolen from the residence. No suspects at this time-Investigative Division has the case.***
- ***In the month of February Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 547 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 195 Traffic Stops, 32 traffic crashes, 10 disturbances, and 14 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***
- ***In the month of March Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 652 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 252 traffic Stops, 20 traffic crashes, 12 disturbances, and 36 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

### **Item #1**

On February 1, Deputy Winistorfer conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for a lane deviation violation. The driver was found to be intoxicated. The driver was arrest for OWI-2nd offense.

### **Item #2**

On February 4, Deputy Loppnow participated in a sting operation with the Brown County Sheriff's Office Investigative Division. The sting targeted prostitution & escorting without a license. A total of 12 ordinance citations were issued for violations of patronizing a prostitute, escorting without a license, and pandering. The purpose of the operation was to target those involved with prostitution related activity and send a message that they won't be tolerated in Allouez.

### **Item #3**

On February 15, Deputies responded to the area of Libal St. at E. Briar Ln. for a single vehicle crash in which the vehicle rolled over. The driver of the vehicle had left the scene and was found a short time later at his residence which was not far from the crash. The driver was found to be intoxicated and arrested for OWI.

### **Item #4**

On February 16, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Dow responded to an address in the 1500 block of Webster Ave to attempt to locate a female with warrants for her arrest. The female was located and arrested/jailed for the warrants.

### **Item #5**

On February 16, Deputy Mleziva and other Deputies responded to an address in the 400 block of E. Mission Ave for a report of a male who was robbed. The victim provided a written statement saying he was robbed by two individuals. It was later found that the

victim made up the story. The male was arrested for obstructing an officer and also given a citation for underage drinking.

**Item #6**

On February 22, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. at Allouez Ave. Upon contact with the driver the odor of marijuana was obvious. After a search of the vehicle a small amount of marijuana was located. The driver was issued several traffic citations and a citation for possession of marijuana.

**Item #7**

On February 26, Deputy Buresh and other Deputies responded to an address in the 1400 block of Bismark St. for a disturbance between two males. After interviewing the parties involved one male was arrested for disorderly conduct and battery.

**Item #8**

On February 27, Deputy Loppnow and Deputy Pizzala responded to an address in the 1400 block of McCormick St to attempt to locate a female with warrants through the Allouez Municipal Court. A male party answered the door and the odor of marijuana coming from the residence was apparent. The male was cooperative and allowed officers inside the residence. Several bags of marijuana were seized. The two male parties at the residence were both cited for possession of marijuana. The female with the warrants was not located.

**Item #9**

On February 27, Deputy Winistorfer conducted a traffic stop on Libal St. near Beaupre St. The operator was found to be intoxicated and arrested for OWI 6th.

**Item #10**

On March 2, Deputy Mleziva and Deputy Dow responded to an address in the 600 block of Kalb St. to attempt to locate a male with warrants for his arrest. The male was located and arrested.

**Item #11**

On March 3, Deputy Loppnow and Deputy Vogel assisted the Brown County Drug Task Force with a search warrant in the 3600 block of Glenhaven Ln. One suspect was taken into custody and several items of drug paraphernalia were seized.

**Item #12**

On March 9, Deputies responded to an address on Allouez Ter. to attempt to locate a male with warrants for his arrest. The male was located and arrested on the outstanding warrant.

**Item #13**

On March 9, Deputies responded to an address on Floral Dr. to attempt to locate a female with warrants for her arrest. The female was located and arrested.

**Item #14**

On March 10, Deputy Loppnow and other Deputies responded to Allouez Optimist Park for a report of two males smashing bricks near the concession stand. The male were located and questioned. After questioning & observed the damage one of the male was arrested/jailed for damage to property, possession of drug paraphernalia, & bail jumping. The second male was cited for disorderly conduct.

On March 30, Deputy Kiehnau responded to Webster Avenue Market for a retail theft call. Store employees had video surveillance of a male party shoplifting. The male also made a Western Union transaction in which he provided his name. The male was later located and cited for retail theft.
