Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

A fire alarm is something that all of us hope only to hear during a fire drill. Unfortunately, this ear piercing sound can be heard in businesses and apartment buildings throughout the City of Green Bay and the Village of Allouez on a daily basis. Sometimes it's due to a system test, a false alarm, or a legitimate fire.

Hearing a fire alarm instills fear and panic into "most" people. This is what drives them to hastily leave the building. They fear fire and its deadly fast speed. Notice that I said "most" people. Others are initially startled by the fire alarm but then take a "half-hazard" approach. They try to analyze something that needs no analyzing, and think of the possible reasons for a false alarm. Fire is responsible for about 3000 deaths, 19000 injuries and over \$10 billion in damages annually in the US. Surely most people fear fire, right? Most likely the answer is yes. They do indeed fear fire but rationalize that it will never happen to them. A potentially deadly mistake if it indeed is a real fire.

Here are some things to keep in mind when you hear a fire alarm:

- The sound of a fire alarm means that **you must get out of the building!** Leaving the building is not an option or choice. It is mandatory.
- Don't stop to collect your personal belongings. Fire doubles in size every 30 seconds so time is something that you don't have.
- Once you are safely out, never go back inside for anything.

Don't let yourself become complacent when you hear a fire alarm. The one time that you fail to heed the warning of the alarm, could be your last!

- *April 11: Deputy Pizzala responded to Woodlawn Cemetery for a damage to property report. The caller reported numerous headstones vandalized/broken. No suspects at this time.*
- *April 12th: Deputy Vogel responded to the 1400 block of Boyd St. for a damage to property report. The caller reported their vehicle being written on/vandalized. No suspects at his time.*
- *April 13th: Deputy Pizzala responded to Kiefer Uniforms for a retail theft complaint. The caller reported items stolen from the store and had video evidence. Report and follow up to be done.*
- *April 16th: Deputy Mleziva responded to a residence on Macarthur St. for a theft report. The caller reported numerous lawn ornaments stolen from the yard. No suspects at this time.*
- *In the month of April Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 614 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 252 traffic Stops, 14 traffic crashes, 18 disturbances, and 33 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

Item #1

On April 2, Officers of the Brown County Drug Task Force served a search warrant at a residence on St. Croix Circle. The suspect had been arrested the day before on numerous drug charges. Further drugs and drug paraphernalia was confiscated during the search.

Item #2

On April 3, Deputy Winistorfer responded to a residence on Fernwood Ave to attempt to locate a male with warrants for his arrest. The male was located and arrested/jailed on the warrant.

Item #3

On April 5, Deputies Mleziva and Kazik responded to the Green Bay Correctional Institute for a drug complaint. Correctional Officers had observed a female, who was there visiting, drop a bag of marijuana in the parking lot. Correctional Officer confronted the female while police were called. Upon speaking with the female she admitted that the marijuana was hers and that she was going to attempt to give it to her son, who is an inmate at the prison. The female was arrested/jailed for possession of marijuana.

Item #4

On April 8, Deputy Vogel responded to Webster Avenue Market for a retail theft complaint. A female suspect had left the store and was located a short distance away. The female was cited for shoplifting-3rd offense.

Item #5

On April 8, Deputies responded to an address in the 1400 block of McCormick St. for a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival a male party involved in the disturbance was located hiding in the basement of the residence. After interviewing the parties involved the male was arrested for an outstanding warrant and additional charges of disorderly conduct, damage to property, and trespass to dwelling.

Item #6

On April 10, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to an address in the 200 block of Allouez Ave for a report of a disturbance. Upon arrival and interviewing those involved one male party was arrested/jailed for charges of disorderly conduct and damage to property.

Item #7

On April 15, Deputy Mleziva and other Deputies responded to Allouez Beer Depot for a female causing a disturbance. The female was starting an argument with the owner and threw several items. She was arrested for disorderly conduct.

Item #8

On April 18, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to an address in the 500 block of Clover Ln. for a report of a disturbance between a male and a female. After speaking with those involved the male party was arrested for violation of restraining order.

Item #9

On April 25, Deputy Knepfel and other Deputies responded to a residence in the 1400 block of McCormick Street for a possible disturbance. Several people were located and interviewed. It was determined that no disturbance was taking place, but on male party was cited for possession of marijuana.

Item #10

On April 26, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop of a vehicle for a registration violation on Garland St. near Baird St. During the traffic stop numerous items of narcotics and paraphernalia were located. Two occupants in the vehicle were arrested/jailed for several drug related offenses.

Item #11

On April 28, Deputies from the Brown County Sheriff's Office Investigative regarding prostitution at the Hawthorne Suites on W. St. Joseph St. Two parties were arrested on prostitution related charges.
