Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

Every year, Thanksgiving is the peak day for home cooking fires in the U.S. according to National Fire Protection Association (NFPA). In previous years, the average number of home structure fires involving cooking equipment on Thanksgiving Day was 2000 fires (3X more than any other day)! Cooking is the leading cause of home fires and home fire injuries. Each year, hundreds of people in the United States are killed in fires that involve cooking equipment and thousands more are injured.

Here are some tips for a safe Thanksgiving dinner;

- * Stay IN the kitchen when you are cooking on the stovetop so you can keep an eye on the food.
- * Stay IN the home when cooking your turkey and check on it frequently
 - * Keep kids away from cooking areas.
- * Turn pot handles inward to reduce the risk that pots with hot contents will be knocked over.
 - * Keep combustibles away from your stove top.
 - * Clean up food and grease from burners and the stove top.

A popular method for cooking turkeys is to deep fry them. Though you will probably end up with a juicier turkey, cooked in less than half the time, there are some dangers involved. Here is what you need to know.

- * Fryers are to be used outdoors a safe distance from buildings. They aren't to be used on decks and in garages.
- * Make sure the turkey is completely thawed (24 hours for every 5lbs in the fridge) and be careful with marinades. Oil and water don't mix, and water causes oil to spill over, causing a fire or even an explosion hazard.
- * As with all cooking, pay close attention to the fryer when you are using it.

- *In the month of October Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 568 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 180 Traffic Stops, 31 traffic crashes, 8 disturbances, and 39 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

Item #1

On October 4, Deputy Verheyen responded to a residence in the 500 block of Allouez Ave for a disturbance. After arriving and speaking with the parties involved a male was arrested for damage to property and disorderly conduct.

Item #2

On October 12, Deputy Shield conducted a traffic stop on Webster Ave. at Beaupre St. The operator of the vehicle was found to be intoxicated and arrested for OWI-second offense.

Item #3

On October 14 (2:54a.m.), Deputy Verheyen observed a suspicious male party walking on Webster Ave. near St. Joseph St. Verheyen made contact with the male found that the male had a warrant for his arrest. The male was arrested for the warrant and subsequently searched. The search revealed that the male was in possession of a suspected marijuana pipe. The male was jailed on the warrant and issued a citation for possession of drug paraphernalia.
