-There have been numerous theft/burglary reports as of lately. The incidents include thefts from vehicle's and garages that are left open overnight. Please remember to lock things up!

-In November Deputy Loppnow joined the Brown County Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force for an operation targeting prostitution & human trafficking. The operation focused on internet ads for possible prostitution and resulted in 12 citations being issued through the Allouez Municipal Court for prostitution, patronizing a prostitute, and pandering. The suspects were not Allouez residents, but agreed to meet in Allouez. If they showed up they were arrested/cited.

Decorating for the holidays is something that many families will soon be doing if they haven't started already. Stringing the Christmas lights, trimming the tree, and setting out candles are just a few of the things that we do to make our homes feel festive. In order to have a safe holiday season, we need to take the necessary precautions.

Christmas Trees;

- Select a tree that is not too dry. Grasp a branch about 6" from the end and gently pull outward. Only a few needles should come off.
- Cut 2" off of the base of the tree and immediately place the tree in water which should be checked daily.
 - Keep heat sources away from the tree.
- Trees only take only several weeks to dry out. Throw your tree out right after the holidays.

Candles;

- Candles make your home smell good but they could burn your house down (that won't smell good!)
 - Keep the area around candles clear of combustibles.
 - Never leave your home or go to bed with a candle burning in your home.
 - Take extra care when using candles around pets and children.

Lights;

- Use only Christmas lights that are UL approved.
- Buy the appropriate lights for the placement. Indoor lights should not be used outside.
 - Check the cords for frays and shorts.
- Never plug more light strands together than the manufacturer recommends.
- If you are hanging lights on the outside of your home be extra careful on ladders and roofs.

Common sense goes along way when safeguarding your home. Taking a couple of extra minutes could save your life, family, and home from a tragedy that most likely could have been prevented in the first place.

- ***October 1st:*** Deputy Vogel took a burglary report from a resident in the 800 block of McCastlen St. The resident reported his garage being entered sometime overnight and items missing. No suspects at this time.
- ***October 3rd:*** Deputy Kiehnau responded to an address on Ontonagon Ct for a theft complaint. The caller reported items missing from his vehicle. No suspects at this time.
- ***October 25th:*** Deputy Vogel responded to the apartments on Hilltop Way for a theft report. The caller reported her wallet stolen sometime while she was moving into the apartment complex. No suspects at this time
- ***November 3rd:*** Deputy VonHaden responded to a residence in the 400 block of E. Mission Rd. for a burglary report. The caller reported that his garage had been broken into and change was stolen from his vehicles. No suspects at this time.
- ***November 8th:*** Deputy VonHaden responded to an address in the 2500 block of Bittersweet Ave for a burglary report. The caller reported that vehicles in the driveway and in the garage had been gone through overnight. No suspects at this time.
- ***November 8th:*** Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 2500 block of Oakwood Ave for a burglary report. The caller reported that someone entered her unlocked garage sometime overnight and went through her vehicles. No suspects at this time.
- ***November 9th:*** Deputy Von Haden responded to an address on Hawthorne Pl. for a theft report. The caller reported money taken from their unlocked vehicle sometime overnight. No suspects at this time.
- ***November 11th:*** Deputy Vogel responded to Austin's for a retail theft report. The manager reported the theft of alcohol by two unidentified male parties. The parties are not identified at this time.
- ***November 21st:*** Deputy Vogel responded to an address on Chardonnay Ct. for a theft report. The caller reported a gas card and \$20 missing from his garage. No suspects at this time.
- ***In the months of October & November Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 1,088 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 317 traffic Stops, 60 traffic crashes, 34 disturbances, and 68 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On October 5, Deputy Knepfel and Deputy Rapp responded to an address on Savoie Ct. for a disturbance. After speaking with those involved the male party was arrested/jailed for disorderly conduct.

Item #2

On October 6, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to an address on Bryan St. for a disturbance. Upon contacting/interviewing those involved a male party was arrested/jailed on charges of disorderly conduct and damage to property.

Item #3

On October 7, Deputies responded to an address Derby Lane for a possible violation of court order by a male and female party. The two parties were both found to be in violation of the terms of their bond from jail. Both were arrested for bail jumping.

Item #4

On October 17, Deputies responded to an address on Fernwood Dr. for a disturbance between two male parties. It was also reported that they possibly had firearms. Upon arrival Deputies made contact with the males. One of the males was arrested for disorderly conduct and going armed while intoxicated. Firearms were present at the residence, but not part of the incident.

Item #5

On October 17, Deputies responded to an address in the 800 block of Karl St for a disturbance between a male and female. The male had left the scene prior to officer arrival, but returned a short time later. The male was arrested for outstanding warrants.

Item #6

On October 20, Deputy Knepfel took a left of wallet/credit cards report at Faith Lutheran Church on Webster Ave. The credit card was later used at the BP Station next to the church. The Investigation Division was able to follow up with the case and identify the suspect from surveillance video at the gas station. The suspect was later arrested/jailed for theft and fraudulent use of a financial transaction card.

Item #7

On October 24, Deputy Stevens conducted a traffic stop on Allouez Ave near Webster Ave. The operator of the vehicle had warrants for his arrest and was arrested.

Item #8

On October 27, Deputies responded to an address in the 1300 block of S. Van Buren Street for a drug complaint. While in route Deputies located a vehicle involved in the incident and stopped it. Marijuana was located in the vehicle. Two people were arrested for drug charges and one person was arrested at the residence for an outstanding warrant.

Item #9

On November 18, Deputies responded to a residence in the 300 block of Kenney St. for a disturbance. Information received was that a female attempted to run over a male party. After contacting the parties involved the female was arrested for disorderly conduct.

Item #10

On November 20, Deputy Von Haden responded to the Midway Mobile Gas Station for a report of an employee theft. The gas station was able to provide proof that an employee had stolen from them. The employee was cited for theft through the Allouez Municipal Court.

Item #11

On November 25, Deputies responded to an address in the 1900 block of Libal St. for a disturbance call. Information received was that a male and female were arguing and the male displayed a knife. After making contact with the parties the male was arrested for disorderly conduct, battery, & reckless use of a weapon.

Item #12

On November 26, Deputies responded to an address in the 400 block of E. Briar Ln. for a disturbance between a male and female. Upon making contact with both parties the male was arrested for battery and disorderly conduct. Charges for battery and disorderly conduct were referred to the District Attorney for the female.
