-Make sure your child knows never to enter a residence unless you are with them.

-Teach your children never to approach vehicles or strangers.

-Have a pre-arranged meet location set up in the event that you and your child are separated.

-Have children wear reflective costumes and/or carry flashlights so they can be easily seen during hours of darkness.

## Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

Many people have probably turned their furnaces on this year already as temperatures are creeping down at night. Every year in the US, heating equipment related fires kill over 400 people, injure more than 1500, and cause almost \$900 million in property damages. Have you properly prepared your furnace and your home for a safe heating season?

Here are the things that you should do to get ready;

- \* Have your furnace inspected by a licensed technician annually. He/ she will make sure that your furnace is running efficiently and check it out for damage and leaks which could lead to carbon monoxide (CO) poisoning.
- \* Have your fireplace chimney inspected on a yearly basis. Creosote buildup can easily cause a chimney fire.
- \* Carbon Monoxide is a silent killer. Place a CO detector in your home to warn you of a heating appliance malfunction. By law, there needs to be one on every level of your home.
- \* Ensure that you have a working smoke detector on each level of your home. This is also a state law.
  - \* Your family should have and practice a fire escape plan.
- \* Maintain a three foot clearance between all heating equipment and anything that can burn. This is especially important with space heaters.

Of the more than 50,000 heating equipment fires that occur every year in the US, the main causes were;

- \* Combustibles placed too close to heating equipment.
- \* Lack of maintenance of the heating appliance or chimney.

As the temperature drops, the number of fires caused by heating equipment rises. Heating equipment is the number one cause of fires during December, January, and February. Remember that almost ALL fires are preventable. Take the necessary steps to safeguard your family during this heating season.

On September 2, Deputy Shield responded to a residence in the 300 block of for a damage to property complaint. The caller reported numerous windows on their house

being smashed by a male with a bat. A suspect was identified and charges have been referred to the District Attorney's Office.

On September 3, Deputy VonHaden conducted a traffic stop on Libal St. at Terraview Dr. The operator of the vehicle was found to have a warrant for his arrest and arrested for the warrant.

On September 7, Deputy Mleziva responded to a residence in the 300 block of Floral St to attempt to locate a party with warrants for her arrest. The female was located and arrested.

On September 24, Deputy Vogel and other Deputies responded to a residence on Fernwood Dr. for report of a disturbance. After contacting those who were involved a female was arrested for disorderly conduct.
