September 2016 Letter
Information for Allouez Residents



With the summer flying by, the 2016-2017 school year is already upon us. This newsletter spoke of this last year but I think we can all agree a yearly reminder is always needed. So with school back in session, the Brown County Sheriff Office deputies will again be aggressively patrolling school zones targeting high speeds and unsafe driving. Please remember that when children are present in school zones the 15 mph speed limit is in effect here in the Village of Allouez. It's also important to always yield the right of way to children, crossing guards, and other pedestrians present in crosswalks. The Village of Allouez has several school zones that become busy at the beginning and end of each school day. These areas and the time line of school zones when children are most likely present include the following:

- Webster Avenue at St. Mathew's St.** - Morning **7:30-8:00am** and Afternoon **3:00-3:30pm**
- Libal St. at Broadview Dr.**- Morning **8:30-9:00am** and Afternoon **3:15-3:50pm**
- Libal St. at Hilltop Dr.**- Morning **7:40-8:10am** and Afternoon **2:50-3:20pm**
- Libal St. at Longview Ln.**- Morning **7:45-8:15am** and Afternoon **2:40-3:10pm**

There will also be crossing guards at both of the roundabouts on school days. The roundabout at **Libal/Allouez** will have a crossing guard present **7:45-8:15am** and **3:00-3:30pm**. The roundabout at **Libal/Hoffman** will have two crossing guards present **7:30-8:00am** and **3:00-3:45pm**. Just as the radio commercial states, "When you see a roundabout, TAKE IT SLOW".

New this year Allouez will have crossing guards stationed at the intersections of **Webster Ave/Greene Ave** and **Libal St/Greene Ave** to help children cross the street. Both locations will have guards present at **7:30-8:00am** and **3:00-3:45pm**.

Escape Planning

PLAN AHEAD- If a fire breaks out in your home, you may have only a few minutes to get out safely once the smoke alarm sounds. Everyone needs to know what to do and where to go if there is a fire.

SAFETY TIPS

- * Draw a home escape plan and discuss it with everyone in your home.
- * Practice the plan at night and during the day with everyone in your home, twice a year.
- * Know at least two ways out of every room, if possible. Make sure all doors and windows leading outside open easily.
- * Have an outside meeting place (like a tree, light pole or mailbox) a safe distance from the home where everyone should meet.
- * Practice using different ways out.
- * Teach children how to escape on their own in case you can't help them.
- * Close doors behind you as you leave.

IF THE ALARM SOUNDS...

- * If the smoke alarm sounds, get out and stay out. Never go back inside for people or pets.
- * If you have to escape through smoke, get low and go under the smoke to your way out.
- * Feel the knob and door before opening a door.
- * Call the fire department from outside your home.

FACTS• According to an NFPA survey, only one in four Americans have actually developed and practiced a home fire escape plan.

- While 66% of Americans have an escape plan in case of a fire, only 35% of those have practiced it.
- One-third of American households who made an estimate thought they would have at least 6 minutes before a fire in their home would become life-threatening. The time available is often less. And only 8% said their first thought on hearing a smoke alarm would be to get out!

August Police Reports

- ***August 3rd: Deputy K. Mason responded to the YMCA parking lot at address 380 Broadview Dr. for a report of a theft from an unsecured vehicle. The victim reported her purse was stolen from her vehicle. The victim stated she left her windows cracked. Statement taken and report completed. No suspects at this time.***

- ***August 9th: Deputy C. Resch responded to an address on the 3900 Block of W St. Croix Cir for a report of damage to property. The victim reported there is an on going issue their house being egged. Victim reports she has a high schooler child at her house. Possible suspect given is high school aged. Statement obtained and report completed.***
- ***August 13th: Deputy Mason responded to an address on the 300 block of Warren Ct for a report of criminal damage to property. The victim stated the one of their vehicles parked in the driveway had their tires slashed sometime that night. Unknown suspects at this time. Report completed and forwarded to the BCSO Investigative Unit.***
- ***August 15th: Deputy S. Knutson was sent to Webster Ave Market, located at 1220 S Webster Ave, for a report of retail theft. It was being reported the 2 suspects (described as Male/Black and the other Female/Black, both in their mid 20's) left the store without paying for meat products. Unknown suspects at this time. The area was checked but the suspects were not located. Video surveillance is being requested. Statement obtained from victim and incident report completed.***
- ***August 21st: Deputy Brown and other deputies responded to the 500 block of Clover Ln for a report of a possible burglary. The victim reported a screen to one of her windows was cut. Deputies arrived and checked the house with the victim. The victim reported no items were stolen from the house. The victim could not provide any suspects at this time. Statements obtained and report completed.***
- ***In the month of August deputies responded to or initiated approximately 602 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 138 Traffic Stops, 26 Traffic Crashes, 22 Disturbances, and 33 Suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On August 2nd, Deputy K. Mason and Deputy D. Fameree responded to a residence in the 600 block of Blackhawk Dr for a report of a disturbance with an out of control female. The deputies responded and found the female intoxicated. To keep the family members

separated for the evening, the suspect female was transported to a shelter downtown. The suspect female then caused a disturbance at said shelter. The suspect female was then taken into custody by deputies and transported to the Brown County Jail on disorderly conduct charges.

Item #2

On August 4th, Deputy C. Brown and other deputies responded to the intersection of Libal St at Allouez Ave for a traffic accident, vehicle vs. house. The vehicle in question then drove away from the scene before police arrival. The owner/operator was later located and arrested for OWI. The suspect was also issued citations for Hit and Run Property Adjacent to Highway, Failure to Maintain Control of Vehicle, and Failure to Notify Police of an Accident.

Item #3

On August 9th, Deputy Mason responded to Resurrection Church located at 333 Hilltop Dr for a report of juveniles throwing rocks through their windows. The staff showed Deputy Brown the damaged window. The area was checked but the suspects were not located. Incident report completed.

Item #4

On August 11th, Deputy Mason and DEO Vogel were again dispatched to Resurrection Church, 333 Hilltop Dr, for a report of the same juveniles damaging school property. The juveniles were located at this time. The juvenile's parents were contacted and arrived on scene. The juveniles were given a must appear court date to speak with the municipal judge. The suspect juveniles were then released to their parent's custody.

Item #5

On August 13th, Deputy Brown and multiple Brown County deputies were sent to an address on the 700 block of Derby Ln for a report of a disturbance. It was reported the victim was thrown off a deck at this address and sustained injuries. The suspect left the scene before police arrival. Deputies later checked the suspect's address listed with DOT but were unable to locate the suspect at this time. Statements obtained and report completed. Charges forwarded to the District Attorney's Office for Battery on suspect.

Item #6

On August 13th, Deputy D. Davidson and other BCSO deputies were dispatched to Hawthorn Suites, at 335 W St Joseph St, for a report of a disturbance. It was reported an intoxicated individual was knocking on doors and using foul language. Deputies arrived and were able to locate the suspect. The suspect was arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail on a Disorderly Conduct charge.

Item #7

On August 26th, Deputy Brown and other deputies were dispatched to the area of Jourdain Ln and E St Joseph St for a disturbance in progress. Deputies arrived and were able to locate both parties involved. An investigation was conducted resulting in a female being arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail on a charge of DVO Disorderly Conduct.
