

August 2016 Letter

Information for Allouez Residents

This year I, DEO Vogel, will have a booth at the Allouez Farmer's Market every Thursday from 3:30pm to 6:30pm. My goal is to speak with as many Allouez residents as I can to address any questions/needs that arise in the village/county. On select Thursdays, I will attempt to have a specialized unit from the Brown County Sheriff's Office on hand to show their equipment and to explain how they serve Brown County. To date we have had the MRAT vehicle and Dive Team unit on hand for questions and tours of their vehicles.

Some of the other activities I will have available:

- When no specialized units are available, my police squad car will be open for the children to turn on the lights and to say hello to mom over the intercom system. Great picture opportunity for children sitting in the front seat.
- I will have a sign-up sheet for the adult residents interested in starting up a Neighborhood Watch Program in their area.
- I will be selling The Brown County Sheriff's Office K9 Unit stuffed animal dogs. All proceeds go to the K9 Unit for future K9 equipment & training. If interested, the stuffed animals can be purchased for \$15.
- While supplies last, I will be passing out blue flood lights that were donated by our local Home Depot center for people wanting to show support for police officers. These lights will be passed out, 1 per family, free of charge.
- And passing out anything else I can "borrow" from the DARE unit to pass out to the children. Packers cards, balloons, stickers, ect.

Please stop by and say hello. I will happy to talk to anyone about their concerns and explain what we do here at the Village of Allouez and Brown County Sheriff's Office.

Can Fire and Rescue Vehicles Find Your House?

While driving the village and responding to calls we have noticed many houses without properly addressed houses. The addresses are either too small to read, concealed by trees and shrubs, or not present at all! It is important to make sure your house has its address properly placed and visible to be able to offer fast service when needed. In a medical emergency seconds and minutes can matter. Please help us out by ensuring you can answer YES to all of the following questions which are derived from the village municipal codes.



1. Can it be clearly read from a distance of 50 feet?
Fire trucks and ambulances park in the street on calls so we do not ruin driveways with the weight of our vehicles. Be sure to trim shrubs or trees to allow for an unobstructed view of your address. An additional address on mail boxes can give us a greater chance of finding your house even faster!
2. Is your address at least 3" tall?
Numbers that are too small are hard to read from 50 feet away, especially at night.
3. Is your address in the form of numbers?
Addresses that look like someone wrote it by hand is even harder to read at a distance quickly during the day or night and is not allowed by village municipal code. Please use NUMBERS to address your house.

June Police Reports

- ***July 1st: Deputy C. Brown responded to an address on the 200 block of Bryan St. for a report of a suspicious person with a flashlight walking around a neighbor's house. Deputies responded and learned the tenant had locked himself out of the house.***
- ***July 1st: Deputy C. Brown and multiple deputies responded to an address on the 200 block of Taft St for a report of someone possibly breaking into their home. The complainant stated she could hear banging noises inside and outside of the house. The complainant locked herself in the bathroom until officers arrived. The house was searched and no one was found inside. There was no evidence of a break in found.***
- ***July 5th: Deputy C. Resch responded to Resurrection Church located at 333 Hilltop Dr. for a report of a criminal damage to property. The victim reported a window was smashed out in one of their construction vehicles. The victim believed it happened over the weekend. No suspects at this time. Statement obtained and report completed by Deputy Resch. Follow up being done on surveillance video footage. Case referred to the BCSO Investigative Unit.***
- ***July 5th: Deputy Resch responded to an address on the 300 block of Greene Ave for a theft report. The victim reported her medication was stolen. The victim provided suspect information. Report completed with follow up needed.***
- ***July 10th: Deputy J. Rusk responded to an address on the 2000 block of Jourdain Ln for a report of burglary. The victim stated the house was left unlocked and items were now missing from the home. Suspect information was provided. Report completed and forwarded to the BCSO Investigative Unit.***
- ***July 15th: Deputy Resch was sent HVS Advertising and Marketing, located at 2021 S Webster Ave, for a report of theft from a vehicle. The victim believes her vehicle was locked at the time of the theft but no damage to the vehicle was reported. Unknown suspect at this time. Video surveillance is being requested from neighboring businesses. Statement obtained from victim and incident report completed.***
- ***July 28th: Deputy Rousseau responded to the 3400 block of East River Dr. for a report of fraud. The victim reported an unknown suspect opened up a credit card by using their name and social security number. Statement obtained and incident report completed.***
- ***In the month of June deputies responded to or initiated approximately 633 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 154 traffic Stops, 24 traffic crashes, 21 disturbances, and 46 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On July 1st, Deputy Brown performed a routine traffic stop on vehicle for expired registration on a vehicle driving on East River Dr. The driver was found to be intoxicated and was taken into custody on OWI 1st. A search of the vehicle found the passenger to be in possession of an illegal controlled substance. Citation issued to passenger for possession of a controlled substance.

Item #2

On July 11th, Deputy S. Knutson responded to an address on the 3300 block of East River Dr for a report of a verbal disturbance. Deputies responded and were able to determine the disturbance was verbal only and not physical. One of the parties involved was found to have an active warrant on a different matter and was taken into custody.

Item #3

On July 12th, Deputy Rousseau and DEO J. Vogel responded to the 600 block of Memory Ave for a disturbance of an out of control male subject. Deputies responded and the male was immediately detained. After statements were obtained from the victims, the male was transported to the Brown County Jail for charges of DVO Battery, DVO Disorderly Conduct, and Criminal Damage to Property.

Item #4

On June 12th, Deputy Lauder performed a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling on Allouez Ave for the registration of the vehicle being suspended due to unpaid parking tickets. A strong odor of marijuana was coming from the vehicle. The operator was asked to step outside the vehicle and drug paraphernalia was located on her person. The vehicle was then searched and more paraphernalia along with a green leafy substance was located. The operator was issued citations for Possession of Marijuana and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia.

Item #5

On July 17th, Deputy K. Mason and other deputies were sent to an address on the 2000 block of Woodrow Way for a report of a possible burglary in progress. It was reported the suspects ran towards Webster Elementary School. Deputies surrounded the area but the suspects were not located. The home was cleared by deputies and no suspects were located inside. The home owner was notified and arrived on scene. The home owner searched the house with deputies and reported no items were missing from the house. The home owner provided a stated and a list of two suspects well known by the home owner. Report completed and follow up being conducted.

Item #6

On July 19th, Deputy T. Campbell and other deputies responded to an address on the 300 block of Simonet St for a report of a disturbance. Deputies arrived on scene and placed one male into custody. Statements obtained and incident report was completed. The male was transported to the Brown County Jail on a disorderly conduct charge.

Item #7

On July 21st, Brown County Traffic Team Deputy D. Peterson performed a traffic stop on a vehicle traveling on STH 172 at Webster Ave for heavily tinted windows. A record check showed the registered owner was currently suspended. The operator was identified and a record check showed his driver's license was currently revoked. There was also a local active warrant for the operator at this time. The operator was taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail where he was able to post his bond. Citation of Operating after Revocation was issued to the operator.

Item #7

July 29th, Deputies Brown, A. Lemberger, K. Verheyen, C Lauder, and Sgt. B Brodbeck responded to an address on the 300 Block of Simonet St. for a report of a disturbance. Parties at the residence were seperated. Statements were obtained resulting in one male party taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail on Disorderly Conduct charges. DEO Vogel responded to this same address the next day and issued this same male a municipal ordinance citation for Maintaining a Chronic Nuisance Property.

Item #8

July 30th, Deputy Brown was performing a security check at Wiese Park and observed a suspicious vehicle. A traffic stop was performed. Contact was made with the operator and passenger. The operator stated they were playing Pokemon at the park and did not know the park closed at 10pm. Deputy Brown detected an odor of marijuana coming from the vehicle and asked the suspects about it. The operator and passenger were then honest stating they had been smoking marijuana in the park. The two suspects handed over the green leafy substance they stated was marijuana. The rest of the vehicle was searched. Both subjects were issued citations for Possession of a Controlled Substance and Possession of Drug Paraphernalia. The operator's mother picked up the two individuals from the scene.

Item #9

July 30th, Deputies Rousseau and W. Buresh were dispatched to the Green Bay Correctional Institution (GBCI) for a report of drugs. It was reported a visitor was attempting to smuggle in cigars and what appeared to be marijuana. Deputies arrived and tested the green leafy substance. The substance tested positive as marijuana. The suspect visitor was arrested and transported to the Brown County Sheriff's Office for Manufacturing/Delivery of THC.
