## March 2016 Deputies

Each year Deputies of the Brown County Sheriff's Office have the opportunity to change positions within the department. This means that each year the Village has the potential to see some new faces working in the Village. This year we will have three new Deputies working in Allouez. These officers are not necessarily new to the Brown County Sheriff's Office, just new to Allouez. Deputies work on a 6 days on and 3 days off rotation.

Deputy Justin Rousseau replaced Deputy Randy VonHaden as the full time day shift officer 6a-2p. Justin has been on the Department for approximately 5 years. Justin is currently on the Brown County Sheriff's Office boat patrol and was a member of Brown County Field Force Team. Justin was born and raised in the Green Bay area. Justin's father, retired Deputy Gene Rousseau, previously worked for the Brown County Sheriff's Office for 26 years.

Deputy Kyle Mason replaced Deputy Joseph Mleziva on the full time 2p-10p shift. Deputy Mason was also born and raised in the Green Bay area. Deputy Mason previously worked as an officer for the Wisconsin State Patrol before accepting a position with Brown County Sheriff's Office last year.

Deputy Colin Brown will be replacing Deputy D. Knepfel on the full time night 10p-6a shift this March. Deputy Brown also previously worked as an officer with the Wisconsin State Patrol before joining the Brown County Sheriff's Office.

## Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

According to the US Fire Administration's latest report (2010), clothes dryers are responsible for an estimated 2,900 fires in residential homes. From 2008-2010, dryer fires killed an average of 5 people, caused 100 injuries, and \$35 million in property damage per year. We've see our fair share of dryer fires here in Green Bay and in the surrounding communities.

What do you think was the #1 cause of the 2,900 dryer fires? Failure to clean (34%) was the biggest one. Here is how to prevent a dryer fire in your home;

- Clean out the lint trap after every load has finished. A full lint trap will cause your dryer to run longer and work harder because of the restricted airflow.
- Clean the ductwork periodically including the vent that is on the outside of your home.
- Clean behind the dryer. Lots of lint can collect under and behind it.
- Replace the plastic or foil ductwork with the rigid or semi-rigid ductwork. The plastic and foil ductwork is more prone to kinks and getting crushed thereby restricting airflow.
- Don't dry any clothing that may have had flammable liquids spilled on them.

You must always keep a watchful eye on a heat source such as a dryer which means that you shouldn't use a dryer when you're not home or sleeping. This doesn't mean that as soon as you turn your back on your dryer it will burst into flames. It means that if something does happen to go wrong, you will be there, be alerted to a problem (smoke possibly) and hopefully be able to do something about it before it burns your home down.

- ***February 1st: DEO Vogel responded to a residence on Saint Francis Dr for a fraud complaint. The victim reported an unknown person gained access into his banking account and changed the password and security code questions. No money was stolen from his account due to immediate notification by the bank and victim's response to close account. Report completed-no suspects at this time.***
- ***February 3rd: Deputy Mason responded to a residence on Karl St for a fraud complaint. The victim reported someone wrote out banking checks in their name and is using their social security number. Victim reports this is related to a mugging incident that occurred in the City of Green Bay in 2012. Report completed and there are no suspects at this time.***

- ***February 8th:*** Deputy Fameree responded to a residence on Martha Ave for a fraud complaint. The victim reported someone attempted to file taxes under their name. Reported completed and there are no suspects at this time.
- ***February 11th:*** DEO Vogel responded to a residence on Somerset DR for a fraud complaint. The comp/victim reported they completed their taxes but were then notified by the IRS someone had already filed taxes using their name and social security number. The victim then reported in Nov. 2015 an unknown suspect had requested an address change to their credit card. Only the credit card company fraud department was notified at that time. Report completed and assigned to the BCSO investigative unit.
- ***Feb 15th:*** Deputy Mason responded to Colonial Wine on Webster Ave for a report of criminal damage to property. Victim stated someone "keyed" their vehicle. A suspect name and photo was given. Report completed and forwarded to the BCSO investigative unit.
- ***Feb 17th:*** Deputy Verheyen responded to an address on Memory Ave for a report of a suspicious vehicle/persons. The complainant stated it appeared 4 people attempted to break into their parked vehicle. The suspect vehicle (a white 4-door, possibly a Saturn) drove off before police arrival. The area was checked but was not located. Upon inspection the parked vehicle was "egged". The complainant stated he has two teenage boys and they probably have something to do with this. Incident documented in case of future similar incidents.
- ***Feb 27th:*** Deputy Rousseau responded to an address on Memory Ct. for a report of identity theft. The complainant stated an unknown suspect had opened a Verizon phone account in their name. Deputy Rousseau obtained a statement from the victim and completed a report.

#### **Item #1**

On 2/8/16 at approx. 5:15pm, Deputy Mason responded to the area of Lazzarre Ave and Riverside Dr for a report of a female pulling over to the side of the road for a possible medical issue. Deputy Mason responded along with Green Bay Fire/Rescue. Deputy Mason reported smelling a strong odor of marijuana emitting from the vehicle. Deputy Mason and Deputy Z. Roush were later able to locate green leafy substance in the vehicle during a probable cause search. A male was later issued a citation for possession of marijuana.

#### **Item #2**

On 2/13/16 during the nighttime hours Deputies D. Davidson, J. Rapp, Z. Roush, Sanborn, and Sgt. T. Johnson responded to Hawthorne Suites on St. Joseph Dr. for a possible physical disturbance in progress. It was reported the disturbance was in the parking lot. Deputies responded and later learned there was a verbal altercation and that no one was hurt. Most of the party had already left the scene before police arrival. The other parties were separated and police cleared the scene.

#### **Item #3**

On 2/17/16 at approx. 11:30am, Deputy Rousseau and Investigative Sgt. R. Loppnow responded to an address in the 500 Block of Somerset Dr. for a report of a stolen license plate. Someone had switched WI license plates on the victim's vehicle without his knowledge. A report was completed by Deputy Rousseau and the license plates in question were entered as stolen.

#### **Item #4**

On 2/23/16 at approx. 7:30pm, Deputies Mason and Kiehnau, responded to the 300 block of Beaupre St for a report of Male/Female verbal disturbance. Deputies responded

with no one on scene arguing. Deputy Mason was able to speak with the complainant who stated the parties in question had left in an unknown vehicle. The complainant stated the argument was just verbal. Attempts were made to contact the two suspects but were unsuccessful.

**Item #5**

On 2/24/16 at approx. 10:00am, DEO Vogel performed a traffic stop on a vehicle speeding on Webster Ave. The operator was identified as having 2 warrants for her arrest. The suspect was issued 2 traffic citations and a municipal ordinance citation for obstruction. The suspect was arrested on the 2 warrants and transported to the jail without incident.

**Item#5**

On 2/28/16 at approx. 12:30pm, Deputies Z. Roush, D. Reese, and J. Mleziva responded to an address on the 300 block of Allouez Ave. for a disturbance. It was reported a female was out of control and being violent. The female was not cooperative with deputies upon their arrival and was eventually arrested for Disorderly Conduct and Resisting Arrest. Alcohol may have been a factor in this situation.
