Yearly Reminders for Spring/Summer

The Village is currently preparing for the 40th annual Bellin Run. Close to 20,000 people are expected to participate in this year's event. The Brown County Sheriff's Office, Green Bay Police Dept., Green Bay Metro Fire Dept., Allouez Street Dept., Brown County Hwy Dept., Green Bay Street Dept., and Bellin officials have been meeting and planning the course set-up and emergency plans. The run will be held on June 11th starting at approximately 8a.m. At about 7:45a.m. until about 12p.m. the course route, which is mostly in Allouez, will be shut down and no vehicles/traffic will be allowed. Allouez Parks

Every year during this time the Village receives several complaints about dogs being off-leash in parks/trails and also owners not cleaning up after their dogs. In order to enhance everyone's experience in the Allouez parks or on the trails please be considerate of the Allouez ordinances regarding animals. Per Allouez ordinance 6.06 dogs must be on a leash no longer 6 feet in length. Additionally anyone walking a dog off the owner's property must have equipment to clean up any defecation by the animal. Those caught violating the ordinance could face a fine starting at \$187.

Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

Riding a bicycle is enjoyed by many people. Some ride for fun and exercise and others are riding to save on fuel costs. Unfortunately, the Green Bay Metro Fire Department responds to many bicycle accidents every year.

In 2010, 515,000 people in the U.S. were treated for bicycle-related injuries and more than 800 died due to those injuries as reported by the National Center for Injury Prevention and Control. Children 14 and under are five times more likely to be injured on a bicycle than older riders.

Here are some tips to help keep yourself and your family safe when bicycling:

- * Wear a helmet. You are 14 times more likely to die in a crash if not wearing a helmet!
- * Wear bright colored and reflective clothing so that you are easily visible to other motorists.
- * Do not ride on the sidewalk. When you come off of the sidewalk to cross the street, you are invisible to turning motorists.
 - * Ride with traffic not against it. How are you going to make a right turn? 25% of bicycling collisions are a result of riding the wrong way.
- * Stay at least 3 feet away from the curb. If you ride too close to the curb you are more likely to be out of motorists' field of view. Legally you have a right a whole lane.
- * Give 3ft. of space between you and parked cars. A door could open at any moment.
 - * Use bike lanes when possible.
 - * Use a headlight and taillight when riding at night.
 - * Use the proper hand signals.

Bicyclists are small and often hard to see on the road, as motorists are used to sharing the road with other cars. Taking the proper steps to be seen and always wearing a helmet will help keep you and your family safe on two wheels this summer.

- ***April 2nd: Deputy Fameree responded to a residence in the 1400 block of Hastings St for a fraud complaint. The complainant reported a fraudulent charge on her credit card of over \$900. The complainant has no idea who made this transaction. The credit card company requested a police report be made. Report completed and sent to the Investigative Division.***
- ***April 3rd: Deputy Mleziva responded to an address in the 600 Block of Briar Ln for a fraud report. The complainant reported she was notified by the IRS that someone had already filed her tax return. The complainant then learned the unknown suspect had also filed for a credit card by using her social security number. Report completed and sent to the Investigative Division.***
- ***April 3rd: Deputy C. Brown responded to a residence on the 500 block of Blackhawk Dr. The victim reported their license plates were stolen off their truck on either April 2nd or 3rd. The victim has no idea who would have done this and there was no physical evidence left at the scene. Statement obtained and report completed.***
- ***April 15th: Deputies R. Wagner and K. Stahl responded to Allouez Parkside Village retirement homes located at 1901 Libal St for a report of an unknown Male walking around the outside of the building and looking inside. The area was checked but deputies were unable to locate the suspect. It should be noted this same complaint occurred later that same night and on 4/22. After further investigation by DEO Vogel with the staff, it was learned this is an ongoing issue that occurs with some regularity during the nighttime hours. The White/Male suspect has been seen wearing a whitish hooded sweatshirt and sometimes wears a mask (Scream/Jason Hockey Mask). Continued efforts are being taken to identify this trespasser. If you have any information on this suspect please contact the Brown County Sheriff's Office or DEO J. Vogel.***
- ***In the month of April Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 560 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 167 traffic stops, 20 traffic crashes, 20 disturbances, and 37 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

Item #1

On April 7th, Deputies T. Callow and D. Magnin were dispatched to take a report of a physical disturbance that occurred on the 1200 block of Short St. The victim reported there was a physical disturbance at an address in this area. A statement was obtained from the victim. The suspect was located and taken into custody for Battery and Disorderly Conduct. Both charges have a domestic abuse assessment enhancer assessed to them.

Item #2

On April 14th, Deputy P. Giesler was dispatched to an address on the 700 block of Terraview Dr. for a report of fraudulent charges to the victim's debit card. The victim reported his wallet had been stolen approx. one month ago and claimed to have canceled everything at that time. The victim states there was also an attempt to open a new account. Unknown suspects at this time. Statement obtained and report completed.

Item #3

On April 17th, Deputies J. Rousseau, A. Adams, J. Rusk, and B. Cleven responded to an address on the 300 block of Simonet St for a possible physical disturbance in progress. Upon investigation a male suspect was taken into custody for Battery, Disorderly Conduct, and a Probation Violation. The Battery and Disorderly Conduct charges have a domestic abuse assessment enhancer assessed to them.

Item #4

On April 17th, Deputy Rousseau, other Deputies, and Green Bay Fire/Rescue responded to an accident with possible injuries on STH 172 eastbound at Webster Ave. Witnesses were reporting a motorcycle lost control and “wiped out” in the median of the highway. Upon arrival the male was conscious and breathing. A witness did not see the male wearing a helmet. GB Rescue transported the male to a local hospital for evaluation. Accident report completed.

Item #5

On April 23rd, Deputy R. Wagner was sent by dispatch to St. Vincent’s ER to complete a report for an assault that took place at the Green Bay Correctional Institute (GBCI). It was reported a staff member was assaulted by an inmate. The Brown County Sheriff’s Office regularly handles the initial report on these assaults at GBCI. Deputy Wagner responded and obtained a statement from the victim. A report was completed and forwarded to the investigative unit for follow up.

Item #6

On April 26th, Deputy K. Mason and Deputy D. Dow responded to an address on the 1400 block of Hastings St for an attempt to locate a person with an active warrant. The male had multiple traffic warrants with the Brown County Sheriff’s Office. The cooperative male was located at the address and taken into custody. The male was transported to the Brown County Jail without incident.

Item #7

On April 30th, Deputy Rousseau was sent to an address on the 3600 block of Sunnyslope St for a report of theft. The victim reported that a guitar was stolen from his house sometime in the last several months. The victim did report having suspects he believed committed this crime. A statement was obtained from the victim and the report was forwarded to the investigative unit.
