October 4-10th is Fire Prevention Week. The theme for this year is “Hear the Beep Where You Sleep”. Three out of five fire deaths occur in homes that do not have a working alarm. Every home should have one on every level (at the bare minimum). We recommend that they be placed outside and inside of every bedroom as well.

Smoke alarms have been around since the 1960’s and have been responsible for saving countless lives ever since. There are basically two sensing technologies that smoke detectors are using at the present time. Ionization detectors are the most widely used and are generally more responsive to fast flaming fires. Photoelectric detectors are generally more responsive to slow smoldering fires. Here are some other things you should know;

- Have both types of detectors in your house (photoelectric and ionization).
- Today you can buy detectors that utilize both detection technologies in the same unit.
- A kitchen is a very poor location for a smoke alarm. This causes nuisance alarms and people often disable the alarm. Consider relocating your alarm if it is in the kitchen.
- Smoke detectors are **only good for 10 years** as recommended by the manufacturers (they are 1/3 less sensitive to smoke after that time period).
- Push the test button on the smoke detectors monthly to make sure that they are working.
- **Never use a match to test a detector** as this could cause the detector to be less sensitive because smoke deposits carbon in the sensing chamber.
- Replace the batteries in smoke detectors at least once per year with clock changes.
- Make sure your children know what to do when they hear a smoke alarm sound.

The latest advancement in smoke alarms in recent years has been the requirement that all residential homes built since 1992 have interconnected smoke alarms. The smoke alarms are powered by the home’s electrical system and have a battery backup. When one alarm sounds they all sound. It’s important to note that hardwired alarms also have a 10 year life and need to be replaced like the battery-only alarms.

- *September 1st: Deputy Loppnow took a theft report from a resident in the 300 block of W. St. Joseph St. The resident reported several cement figures missing from her patio. No suspects at this time.*

- *In the month of September Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 608 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 176 traffic Stops, 25 traffic crashes, 28 disturbances, and 28 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.*

Item #1

On September 1, Deputies responded to an address in the 100 block of Beaupre St. for a disturbance. A male party involved in the disturbance left the scene prior to officer arrival. The male was located a short distance away. After speaking with those involved the male party was arrested for an outstanding warrant.

Item #2

On September 6, Deputies responded to an address in the 600 block of W. Briar Ln. for a father/daughter (adult) disturbance. The female was arrested for disorderly conduct.

Item #3

On September 7, Deputies responded to an address in the 600 block of Memory Ave for a male party that had broken into the complainant's house and was causing a disturbance. The male was the complainant's son. The male was arrested for disorderly conduct and damage to property.

Item #4

On September 11, Deputy Sanborn and other deputies responded to an address in the 3600 block of East River Dr. for a two vehicle crash. One of the parties involved in the crash was being uncooperative with the other driver and causing a disturbance. The male party causing the disturbance was arrested/jailed for disorderly conduct.

Item #5

On September 12, Deputies responded to an address in the 3800 block of East River Dr. for a female vs. male disturbance. The male had left the scene prior to officer arrival. The male was later located at Austin Straubel Airport and arrested for charges of disorderly conduct, battery, and strangulation.

Item #6

On September 19, Deputy Vogel conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Dr. near St. Joseph St for a speeding violation. The driver of the vehicle was found to have a suspended license and a warrant for his arrest. The driver was arrested for the warrant and cited for speeding and operating while suspended.

Item #7

On September 22, Deputy Sanborn was given custody of a found purse that was turned into the Green Bay Police Dept. The purse was found in the 1900 block of Webster Ave. The purse was found to have a marijuana pipe in it along with the owner's information/I.D. When the owner was contacted and responded to pick up the purse she was cited for possession of drug paraphernalia.

Item #8

On September 23, Deputies responded to an address in the 1400 block of McCormick St. to attempt to locate a male who had a warrant for his arrest. The male was located and arrested for the warrant.
