  - Longview Ln. in front of Doty Elementary School

## Green Bay Metro Fire Department-Allouez Station

As the days get shorter during this time of year, many people will find themselves driving to work at sunrise and commuting home near sunset. Sunrise this time of year is at about 6:30am and sunset is around 7pm. Here's the problem, the sun just off of the horizon is "blinding" for drivers. This blinding sun glare causes accidents and fatalities while driving, cycling, and walking. Sun glare was recently blamed on a pedestrian being hit by a car in our area.

As a driver, here's what you can do to help avoid an accident;

- Wear sunglasses (polarized if possible) as this will help to reduce glare.
- SLOW DOWN just like you would during a heavy rain, snow or ice.
- Consider taking a different route that doesn't face you into the sun the whole time you're driving.
- The worst times are 1 hour after sunrise and 1 hour before sunset. Consider traveling at different times to avoid the glare.
- If you have to drive during these times keep your cell phone out of your hands and your eyes on the road.

As a pedestrian or cyclist, here's what to do to avoid being hit by a motorist if you're out during bad glare times;

- Wear bright colored reflective clothing.
- Pedestrians should always use the sidewalk when available. If there are no sidewalks, always walk against traffic so you can see cars coming.
- If the sun is at your back, assume that drivers coming towards you will be blinded. Move completely off of the road if possible.
- Consider altering the times that you will be out on the road with motorists.

When you think of dangerous road conditions it's easy to think about snow and ice. Let's do our best to keep the sun on our minds as a potential danger as well.

- ***August 3:*** Deputy VonHaden responded to an address in the 300 block of Beupre Street for a Burglary report. The caller reported a bicycle stolen from the garage. No suspects at this time.
- ***August 14th:*** Deputies responded to Olejniczak Realty on W. St. Joseph St. for an unknown male party that was located in the building by an employee who was the first one there in the morning. The suspect ran upon being seen. The area was searched but the suspect was not located. It is believed that this might have been the same person who was cited for trespassing at the Webster Heights Condos on August 8th.
- ***August 26th:*** Deputy Buresh responded to Home Medical Equipment on Riverside Dr for a burglary report. The caller reported a shed on the property broken into and items missing. No suspects at this time.
- ***August 31st:*** Deputy VonHaden responded to a residence in the 100 block of W. Briar Ln. for a theft report. The caller reported both license plates stolen from his vehicle that was parked on the street. No suspects at this time.
- ***In the month of August Deputies responded to or initiated approximately 601 police calls in the Village of Allouez. This included approximately 196 traffic Stops, 25 traffic crashes, 17 disturbances, and 53 suspicious person/vehicle/situation calls.***

### **Item #1**

On August 1 (approximately 12:30am), Deputy Knepfel located a suspicious vehicle at East Lawn Park. There were four occupants in the vehicle and one claimed that he was looking for keys that he lost earlier in the day. One of the individuals was found to have a warrant for his arrest. The male with the warrant was arrested and the others were warned for being in the park after hours.

### **Item #2**

On August 5, Deputies Kiehnau and Deputy Stevens responded to a residence in the 1400 block of Garland St. for a male vs. female disturbance. The male left the residence prior to officer arrival. Green Bay located the male in Green Bay and took him into custody a short time later. After interviewing those involved the male was arrested/jailed for battery and a charge of disorderly conduct was referred to the District Attorney for the female.

### **Item #3**

On August 8, Deputies Loppnow and Winistorfer responded to Webster Heights Condos for a report of an unknown person possibly upstairs in the clubhouse at the property. The caller advised that no one should be in the clubhouse and she her someone walking in the upstairs. Loppnow and Winistorfer checked the upstairs and located an intoxicated male party trespassing. The male was cited for trespassing.

### **Item #4**

On August 10, Deputy Sanborn conducted a traffic stop on Riverside Drive a Lazarre Rd. The male driver was to have warrants for his arrest. The male was arrested/jailed on the warrants and issued several traffic citations.

### **Item #5**

On August 10, Deputy Mleziva conducted a traffic stop on Libal St. at Beaupre St. The male driver was found to have warrants for his arrest. The male was arrested for the warrant and issued a traffic citation.

**Item #6**

On August 12, Deputy Sanborn and other Deputies responded to an address in the 2600 block of Libal St. for a disturbance between a male and a female. Upon making contact with the parties involved the male was arrested and taken to jail for damage to property and disorderly conduct.

**Item #7**

On August 13, Deputy Knepfel conducted a traffic stop on Libal St. at Floral Dr. One occupant in the vehicle was found to have a warrant for his arrest. He was arrested/jailed on the warrant.

**Item #8**

On August 17, Deputy Vogel responded to the Webster Avenue Market for a retail theft complaint. Employees had chased & detained a male suspect. The male was arrested for a felony Probation & Parole warrant and issued a citation for shoplifting through the Allouez Municipal Court.

**Item #9**

On August 20, Deputy Sanborn and other Deputies responded to an address on Fernwood Ave. for an unwanted male party. The male left prior to officer arrival, but was later located/arrested for disorderly conduct.

**Item #10**

On August 21, Deputy VonHaden and other Deputies responded to an address in the 200 block of Beaupre St. for a disturbance between a male and female. The male ran from the scene prior to officer arrival and was not located. Charges for the male party of battery and disorderly conduct have been referred to the District Attorney's Office.

**Item #11**

On August 31, Deputy Loppnow conducted a traffic stop on Webster Ave. at Arrowhead Dr. for a registration violation. The operator of the vehicle was found to have a warrant for her arrest. She was cited for the registration violation and arrested for the outstanding warrant.
