## Prescription Drug Take-Back Day

On **October 27<sup>th</sup>, 2018**, the Wisconsin Department of Justice (DOJ) will coordinate a Prescription Drug Take Back Initiative throughout Wisconsin. The Prescription Drug Take-Back Day goal is to provide a safe, convenient, and responsible means of disposal of prescription medications, while also educating the general public about the potential for abuse of these medications. Unused prescription medications in homes create a public health and safety concern, because they can be accidentally ingested, stolen, misused, and abused.

Unused or expired medicine should never be flushed or poured down the drain. Removing potentially dangerous pharmaceutical substances from our state's medicine cabinets helps to prevent them from going into our water supply. Water reclamation facilities are not designed to remove all of them and trace amounts of pharmaceuticals are showing up in rivers and lakes around the world.

No businesses allowed. All waste pharmaceuticals must be generated by a household

**Bring:** Prescription (controlled and non-controlled) and over-the-counter medications, ointments, patches, non-aerosol sprays, inhalers, creams, vials and pet medications.

**Do Not Bring:** Illegal drugs, needles/sharps, aerosol cans, bio-hazardous materials (anything containing a bodily fluid or blood), mercury thermometers, personal care

products (shampoo, soaps, lotions, sunscreens, etc...), household hazardous waste (paint, pesticides, oil, gas).


- Participants may dispose of solid, non-liquid medication(s) by removing the medication from its container and disposing of it directly into a disposal box or into a clear sealable plastic bag. Plastic pill containers should not be collected. Blister packages are acceptable without the medications being removed.
- Liquids will be accepted during this initiative. However, the liquids, creams and sprays must be in their original packaging and evenly distributed within the boxes of collected solid prescription medications. *Liquids without the original packaging will not be accepted.*
- Illicit substances such as marijuana or methamphetamine are not a part of this initiative and should not be placed in collection containers.
- All participants must retain possession of their own medication during the surrender process. Law enforcement personnel should not handle the medications at any time.

In coordination with the Brown County Drug Task Force and the WI Department of Justice the Village of Allouez will be accepting unused/unwanted prescriptions and over the counter medications for proper disposal.

## **SEPTEMBER POLICE INCIDENTS**

**\*ALERT\* \*SUSPICIOUS ACTIVITY\* \*ALERT\***

**The following is a brief synopsis of some of the calls the Brown County Sheriff's Office responded to in the Village of Allouez.**

- ***Sept 4th:*** Deputy E. Ebel and multiple deputies were dispatched to the intersection Longview Ave at Glenbrooke Ln for a suspicious person. The notes indicated the male had been walking on Longview and opening mailboxes. Sgt D. Brown arrived on scene and was able to locate the suspect. The suspect denied looking into anybody's mailbox and stated he was trying to get to his girlfriend's house. The suspect appeared intoxicated as he was not making much sense. The suspect did not know where his girlfriend lived. The suspect was detained and nothing of evidentiary value was located on his person. DOT records showed there was a possible warrant out for this person's arrest. After comparing the tattoos listed on the warrant, to the tattoos on the suspect that he had on his person, it was determined the warrant was for his brother and not for him. The suspect was later released. There was no evidence to show that the suspect was going into people's mailboxes. The suspect was advised to continue on his way and not to go on anybody's property. The suspect agreed and there were no further problems.
- ***Sept 8<sup>th</sup>,*** at approx. 6:00pm, Deputy H. Estano was dispatched to an address on the 2300 block of Riverside Dr. for a theft complaint. Upon arrival, Deputy Estano met with the victim who reported that a wheel barrow was taken from his property in the overnight hours of Friday, September 7, 2018 into the morning of Saturday, September 8, 2018. The victim said the wheel barrow was located near his trash cans, near his driveway. The victim advised he did not give any one permission to take the wheel barrow. He stated that he did not have a suspect in mind and did not want a full report completed as he did not believe an investigation was needed. The victim did however request extra patrol past his residence on Riverside Dr. as well as the Fox River Trail. The victim was provided with a business card that contained the incident number. The victim was advised to contact the Sheriff's Office if anything changed.
- ***Sept 10<sup>th</sup>,*** at approx. 11:00pm, Deputy A. Arts and multiple other Deputies were dispatched to a suspicious situation in the 1000 block of Hastings St. Notes of the call stated that someone was outside crawling around their house. The residents of the home were alerted to the situation because their dog was barking at the garage. The complainant stated he went outside to confront the individual. The complainant said he saw an individual near his home and pursued him east on Hastings St. The suspect then fled north near Clay St, through some back yards. The complainant believed that the individual was male and was wearing a black hooded sweatshirt. Jeffery stated that he thinks this is an ongoing incident and it has happened before (1 previous call of the same type so far in 2018). Deputies searched the immediate and surrounding area near Hastings St. While searching the area Deputies were unable to find anyone relating to this incident in the area. The complainant requested extra patrol in the area. While Deputies were still in the area, another call was reported to dispatch with similar circumstances in the 300 block of E Beaupre St. The caller stated that an individual wearing dark clothing ran into her fence, fell down, then jumped over the fence into her side yard. The complainant was unable to see if the suspect ran into the three stall garage on the north side of the house. Deputies responded to the residence and checked the surrounding area.

*No suspicious person was located in the area or in the garage. Due to the close proximity of the homes these incidents were associated with each other.*

- *Sept 14<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 9:30am, Deputy J. Rusk and multiple deputies were dispatched to an address on the 2300 block of Riverside Dr. for a report of a Suspicious Person. The complainant was reporting a male was mumbling threats while singing and acting very weird. Deputies arrived and were able to speak with the suspect. It was learned the suspect's vehicle had run out of gas which was located across the street. Family and friends were contacted and later responded to the location. Family then advised that the suspect had made suicidal comments on his Facebook page last night. The suspect was transported to the Crisis Center for evaluation with the family agreeing to meet the staff there as well. Incident Report completed by Deputy Rusk.*
- *Sept 23<sup>rd</sup>, at approx. 2:40am, Deputy C. Brown and Deputies B. Plate and his FTO Deputy extraordinary J. Mleziva were dispatched to the area of the 600 block of Greene Avenue for a suspicious person call. Dispatch advised two Male/Black had knocked on the complainant's door stating they were looking for two people. Dispatch stated the complainant also observed them knocking on doors across the street. Dispatch advised the males were last seen walking east on Greene Ave. Deputy Brown arrived in the area and did not initially see anybody in the area but stayed in the area for several minutes to see if the males would reappear. A short time later a m/b was observed riding a bike west on Green Avenue in the area of 604 Greene. The male was stopped and told the reason contact was being made with him. The male was verbally identified and he stated he was lost. The suspect then stated they were hanging out with some friends somewhere else and their friends left in a vehicle on told them to meet them at an address on Greene Ave. The suspect stated he was unsure what his address was and did not know what street he lives on. The suspect was asked about the person he was with and where he was. The suspect stated he did not know where the other male was and did admit to being with another male. At this time deputies had no crime or victims. The suspect was transported to an area in the City of Green Bay.*
- *Sept 26<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 11:45pm, Deputy A. Arts and Deputy B. Sanborn observed a man in East Lawn Park, at the end of Boyd St, after the park was closed. The man stood behind a tree when he saw headlights coming in his direction. The man continued to hide behind the tree while a spotlight on the tree and him. Due to the individuals behavior Deputy Arts advised dispatch to send another unit to his location. The individual behind the tree was advised to come out. The individual was verbally identified. The suspect stated he was playing basketball and was not doing anything wrong. The suspect was becoming agitated and was talking louder. It was explained to the suspect why he was being stopped to talk to and that the park closed at 10pm. The suspect became more cooperative and allowed a pat down search for weapons on his person. Deputy Sanborn advised the suspect did not have any warrants for his arrest. The suspect allowed deputies to search his belongings which showed no evidence of any criminal activity. The suspect was advised he was free to leave and he could not stay in the park after hours. The suspect was cooperative and left without incident.*
- *Sept 28<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 11:30pm, Deputy Desmond was dispatched to an address on the 300 block of W Miramar Dr. for a fraud complaint. The victim reported to Deputy Desmond that she regularly fills out surveys for various companies and was recently approached for a survey by who she believed was Wal-Mart. The suspect advised her to deposit a check at her bank for \$2,900 and then go to Wal-Mart to purchase \$1900 worth of gift cards. The suspect advised the victim to call and give him the numbers on the back of the gift cards. The suspect stated when he got the gift card numbers the victim would be able to keep the extra \$1000*

*left over. The victim did as she was told but after doing so believed this may be a scam. The victim called police to see if it was. Deputy Desmond was able to speak with a staff member at Wal-Mart. Deputy Desmond provided the card numbers for the 4 gift cards purchased. The staff member advised all cards were reading \$0 and that the transactions were completed in Stanton, California. The victim states the suspects do not have any of her banking or social security information and would cut off all communication with the suspects. Report completed. On Sept 30<sup>th</sup>, at approx. 7:00am, Deputy Coffey was dispatched to this same address by the request of the victim. Deputy Coffey arrived and the victim explained she was getting multiple text messages from the suspect "John Luza" who was threatening to get an attorney with they did not continue to work with him. Deputy Coffey explained this is a scare tactic used by the con men to get more money from her. Deputy Coffey called John's number and he did pick up. Deputy Coffey advised John he was no longer able to call and that the victim knew this was a scam. John became quiet and did not answer any more questions hanging up on Deputy Coffey. Deputy Coffey was able to block John's phone number from the victim's phone. The phone number used by the suspect shows it is registered to an individual with a different name living in Sugar Land, Texas.*

## **CRIMINAL/TRAFFIC CALLS**

### **Item #1**

Sept 1<sup>st</sup> @ approx. 3:00pm, Deputy N. Dennis and multiple deputies were dispatched to Wydemere Assisted Living, located at 3001 Riverside Dr, for a report of a male on scene who had made threatening statements. The male was reported to be attempting to get items out of a staff member's car without their permission. Deputies were able to locate the male suspect next to the victim's vehicle. Upon investigation deputies were able to locate a canister of mace and a pocket knife on the suspect's person. DOT records showed there was an active Probation and Parole warrant out for this suspect's arrest. The suspect was taken into custody without incident. The suspect was transported to the Brown County Jail on the active warrant and charges of Disorderly Conduct, Carrying a Concealed Weapon, and Possession of Mace by a Felon.

### **Item #2**

On Sept 2<sup>nd</sup>, @ approx. 11:30pm, Deputy Arts and Deputy Sanborn were dispatched to Bishops Court, located at 289 E. St Joseph St, for a suspicious vehicle parked in their parking lot. The suspect vehicle was located traveling on S Webster Ave and a traffic stop was performed with the vehicle stopping on Dauphin St. The occupants were identified and questioned. K9 Deputy Dernbach responded to the location and performed a K9 search of the vehicle. A substance and syringe were located on the driver's person who admitted to the substance being heroin. A prescription bottle found in the occupant's purse not belonging to the occupant was also located. The operator was taken into custody and transported to the Brown County Jail on charges of Possession of Narcotic Drugs and Possession of a Prescription without a Prescription. The occupant has a charge of Possession of a Prescription Drug without a Prescription being referred to the DA's Office.

### **Item #3**

Sept 6<sup>th</sup>, @ approx. 11:00pm, Deputy Brown performed a security check on East Lawn Park. A vehicle was observed parked in the parking lot with multiple occupants and one person standing next to it. All Allouez parks are closed from 10pm to 6am. While speaking with the occupants Deputy Brown reports smelling an odor of marijuana coming from the suspect vehicle. Multiple deputies arrived on scene to assist Deputy Brown. All parties were questioned and searched in which a roach was located on one suspect. While searching the inside of the vehicle a loaded hand gun was located. All parties were detained and questioned. No one admitted to ownership of the hand gun. 3 of the 4 individuals were arrested and transported to the Brown County Jail with multiple

charges of Party to a Crime, Carrying a Concealed Weapon, Felony Bail Jumping, and Possession of THC varying on each individual.

**Item #4**

Sept 8<sup>th</sup>, @ approx. 2:15pm, Deputy Ebel was dispatched to the Webster Ave Market, located at 1220 S Webster Ave. for a report of retail theft. The store manager reported seeing a Female suspect conceal multiple bottles of liquor into her coat and leaving the store with another Male without paying. The manager and another staff member confronted the suspects in the parking lot. The suspects denied stealing and jumped into a vehicle being driven by a 3<sup>rd</sup> party. The vehicle drove away before police arrival. The suspect vehicle's plates were run and an address in DePere was checked. While checking this address deputies were advised the 3<sup>rd</sup> party was calling dispatch requesting to speak with an officer. Deputy Ebel was able to speak with the 3<sup>rd</sup> party who provided the names and locations of the two suspects involved. An address in the City of Green Bay was checked but no one answered the door. A DOT record check showed the female suspect had multiple retail theft convictions on her record. A citation was mailed to the female suspect for retail theft.

**Item #5**

Sept 11<sup>th</sup> @ approx. 5:30pm, Deputy J. Kiehnau was dispatched to an address on the 2300 block of Greenwald St for a theft report of a handicap placard. Notes in the call stated the complainant observed a "stolen" handicapped placard that belonged to her mother at that location. The complainant advised she knows it's her mother's because of the tag number. Running this placard showed a "cancelled" status that the owner had since obtained a new placard that was valid with tag. Upon arrival, dispatch confirmed with Dodge County (where the owner resides) that they never took a theft complaint. It appeared as though owner simply cancelled the tag after obtaining a new one. There was no stolen status attached to the placard. The complainant advised she wasn't able to make contact due to a restraining order between her and the suspect due to a divorce in pending. Deputy Kiehnau observed a vehicle parked on Greenwald in front of the suspect address. The disabled placard was hanging in the rear view mirror. Deputy Kiehnau spoke with the suspect who stated the complainant gave him the placard to use for his grandmother. Deputy Kiehnau saw no evidence that the suspect intentionally stole or withheld this placard from the owner. Since the owner never reported it stolen no charges are being filed on the suspect. Dodge County was requested to respond to the owners address to find out if the owner would like the placard mailed to her or destroyed. At approx. 7:50PM, Dodge County advised the owner would like her original placard mailed back to her and provided a current phone number for her. Deputy Kiehnau was able to advise the owner that the placard was being mailed back.

**Item #6**

Sept 30<sup>th</sup> @ approx. 2:45am, Deputy N. Stueber performed a traffic stop on Riverside Dr at W St Joseph St. Deputy Stueber noticed an odor of intoxicants. The operator admitted to drinking 3 beers this evening. The operator agreed to perform Field Sobriety Tests. The test was performed with the operator failing and showing multiple clues of intoxication. A search warrant was obtained to get a blood draw. The operator was transported to Aurora Hospital for said blood draw. The operator was later transported to the Brown County Jail on a 12 hour hold.
