The opportunity to connect De Pere to Downtown Green Bay lies within this soil!

Repurposing and redeveloping the GBCI property could bring significant financial benefits to the Village of Allouez and surrounding communities.

- Potential for 1,463 jobs
- \$138.5 million in economic output for Brown County annually
- \$59.3 million in labor income
- New taxable property valuation roughly between \$46.7 million and \$71 million, with \$58.9 million as the median estimate

There is an opportunity for \$1.4 million in new tax revenue.

• 46% would go to the Green Bay School District, 30% to the Village of Allouez, 20% to Brown County and 4% to NWTC



This redevelopment has the opportunity to become a central hub/destination site in Allouez.

It will also serve as a connection between downtown Green Bay and De Pere.

The Eastside of the Fox River lacks a positive location for community and business activities; this site creates that opportunity.
