




Ordinance Citations





*During the summer months the Village of Allouez staff and the Brown County Sheriff's Office get a higher number of complaints made for door to door soliciting. If a solicitor knocks on your door attempting to sell a product please ask to see their identification card for their buisness and the Solicitors Permit issued to them by the Village of Allouez. As you can see above a Solicitor was issued a citation this month on Warren Court for not having a permit. If you come across this please call the Brown County Sheriff's Office non-emergency number at 920-391-7450 and an officer can be sent to check the area to make contact with this individual. The Village of Allouez staff makes frequent notifications on their media outlets as well on who has applied for and has these solicitor permits.



Greater Green Bay Frogger Crosswalk Education and Enforcement 2019

What

The Greater Green Bay Frogger project is an innovative, community partnership to build safer communities, increase walking and biking of people of all ages and abilities, and shift our culture to one where we share the road throughout Greater Green Bay. To achieve these goals, we focus on creating impact on three "E's", engineering, education, and enforcement. This project focuses on education and enforcement as critical components of pedestrian and bicycle transportation and safety.

Why

A regional approach to this event has greater impact especially as people consistently flow between several Greater Green Bay municipalities daily. By expanding the reach out these efforts, you would help to support:

- A larger proportion of the driving public in the metropolitan region impacted by these efforts through education and awareness.
- Greater interest from local media outlets to receive news coverage, thus significantly increasing the educational effort.
- Reinforcement of crosswalk laws by having multiple points to educate drivers and pedestrians on a single day, multiple times during the year.
- A coordinated, regional effort to ensure the safety of our community's residents.

How

Here are a few suggestions to get you started.

- 1) **Pick a Site:** Locate the crosswalk that will have both visibility and impact for your community. This may be a location with past safety concerns, a high volume area, or simply one of your choosing. The AM and PM operation may have the same site or differing sites.
- 2) **People Power:** Assign 2 to 3 officers to this site. One officer acts as the walker (or "frog") while the other is in position to stop vehicles who do not obey the laws. With three individuals, you can have two officers available for stops and education.
- 3) **Time Commitment:** Choose a high traffic time in the morning and afternoon/evening to run the operation for 1 to 2 hours.

How Continued

- 4) **Right Equipment:** Safety is of utmost importance. Here is a listing of suggested items you will need for a successful, safe operation.
- Safety vests for all participants.
 - Traffic cones or other markers to indicate the safe stopping distance.
 - A measuring wheel or laser radar to measure distance.
 - Clipboards and data collection sheets.
 - Pedestrian signs (Note: Some communities have used beacon signs or electronic message boards prior to the education zone to announce of the efforts underway).
 - Hand-held radios, with a predetermined frequency for communication.
 - Handouts or material for drivers describing traffic laws and local pedestrian safety issues (provided).

- The number of warnings issued
- The number of citations issued (if applicable)
- The number of educational contacts made
- The number of drivers who correctly yielded to the decoy officer

The three community dates in 2019 are:

- May 28th
- July 23rd
- September 3rd

We will provide you with education and promotional materials to utilize for the event.

Our goal is for participation from at least four municipalities to expand awareness and for better ROI of our collective efforts. We hope that you will join us to improve the safety for the people in Greater Green Bay!
